9:02 a.m. House of Charities and Envision Program information

Michelle Andres introduced herself to the Board and gave a background of her husband being a retired paramedic/firefighter. Her father was also a Chaplin for the police and fire departments for many years. She is familiar with the drug abuse and homelessness through these avenues and others.

Ms. Andres presented the Envision Center Pilot Program that the city of Spokane is using. This program unites several groups, such as; Career Path, Arc of Spokane, WorkSource, Goodwill, Frontier Behavioral Health District, Spokane Addiction Recovery Centers, Center for Justice and many others to coordinate a complete course for care to those in need. A team member assists the individual needing help, by taking them to the appropriate service provider for their needs and continues to stay with them to provide wrap around services that will create a smooth, continual, coordination of care. With so many resources in a united group and a team member to assist the individual, it has been a successful program.

Ms. Andres would like to see the Tri-cities emulate the Envision Center Pilot Program and see the service providers and churches unite to help those addicted to drugs and reduce homelessness. By having a team member help the individual follow through with services needed, she believes this would reduce the unnecessary ER visits, inappropriate incarcerations and help the whole community. 9:15 a.m. **Public Comment**



Jeffery Robinson is doing a research project on Washington State Mental Health laws and asked if he someone knew where he might find information on this matter. Commissioner Koch referred him to Brad Banks, who is the Mental Health Coordinator in Olympia, WA. Commissioner Peck stated that the legislative authority has the ability to enact a 1/10 of 1% tax to help with the mental health funding. He had proposed in the past, to reduce the Transit tax of 6/10 to 5/10 and use the 1/10 for mental health. This would not raise taxes for citizens and but allow funding to go to mental health. Lourdes has set up a triage center and Commissioner Peck would like to see the funds go to provided services.
