2019 ANNUAL UPDATE AND ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT FOR FRANKLIN COUNTY NONDISCRIMINATION AGREEMENT AND POLICY STATEMENT BETWEEN FRANKLIN COUNTY AND WASHINGTON STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION

WHEREAS, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and other Federal Nondiscrimination statutes prohibit discrimination based on race, color, national origin and sex (gender) in the provision of benefits and services in programs and activities receiving Federal funds; and

WHEREAS, these federal regulations require the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) to ensure that all local agencies receiving United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) funds administered by WSDOT are in compliance with these regulations (23 CFR 200.9(b)(7), 49 CFR 21.3, 49 CFR 21.7); and

WHEREAS, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987 broadened the scope of Title VI coverage by expanding the definition of the terms "programs and activities" to include all programs and activities of Federal aid recipients, subrecipients, and contractors, whether such programs and activities are federally funded or not; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) requires each local agency that receives Federal funds through WSDOT to establish a Title VI Program to prevent discrimination in the provision of benefits and services on federally funded transportation programs and activities; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Franklin County Commissioners, constituting the legislative authority of Franklin County, on January 22, 2019, adopted Resolution 2019-028 – Franklin County Nondiscrimination Agreement and Policy Statement Between Franklin County and Washington State Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, Franklin County is required, per the Title VI program and Non-discrimination Agreement (NDA), to submit an annual report to the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) for review by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), per 23 CFR 200 and 49 CFR 21; and

WHEREAS, such a report is to be compiled and submitted by the Title VI Coordinator; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Franklin County Commissioners has reviewed the proposed report, and finds its submission to WSDOT as being in the best interest of Franklin County;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the attached Title VI Annual Update and Accomplishment Report is hereby approved for submittal to the Washington State Department of Transportation.

The CEO duties of Franklin County are executed by the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners. Standing practice has been for this position to rotate to a different commissioner each year, though the authority remains vested in the position. Currently, Robert Koch is the sitting Chairman for calendar year 2019. Commissioner Clint Didier replaced Rick Miller as a County Commissioner for District 3 this year and Derrick Braaten was hired as the County's Building & Planning Director.

Of the meetings, four (4) were advertised in both English/Spanish and three (3) advised that a Spanish interpreter would be available at the hearing upon request. Interpreters are County employees and are readily available to translate when requested by members of the public in attendance.

Franklin County Public Works Department advertised and posted public notices for the <u>Declaration</u> of <u>Surplus via Public Auction</u> and activities involving the <u>Transportation Improvement Plan</u> in both English and Spanish. The Public Works Department will be making a commitment to advertise their public hearing in both English and Spanish. The Public Works Department is also committed to post future notices (road closures) on their website in both English and Spanish.

In an effort to address Limited English Proficiency issues, Franklin County Public Works is continuing the process of upgrading its website to allow the option of viewing all content in either English or Spanish, the predominant non-English language spoken in Franklin County. It is also in the process of having all announcements and communications transmitted in both languages.

Franklin County Public Works advertises their contracts and request for proposals/qualification through either advertising in the newspaper(s) or in the small works roster maintained by the Municipal Research and Service Center (MRSC). The results are posted on our Public Works website and, if utilizing, a bid management system on the internet (QuestCDN). We are currently working toward providing all web content in English and Spanish.

Franklin County Public Works also post bid opportunities on the Washington State Office of Minority & Women's Business Enterprises Bids & Contracting Opportunities' web page. Both the CRP 602 – Juniper Dunes Recreation Area Access and CRP 614 – Taylor Flats Bridge #903-3.46 projects utilized the OMWBE web page.

No DBE/UDBE contracts were advertised or awarded during this reporting period; however, M2 Industrial of Ellensburg was a subcontractor for Rotschy on the CRP 614 – Taylor Flats Bridge #903-3.46 project is a certified DBE contractor specializing in guardrail construction work.

Franklin County Public Works has updated their standard contracts to include the Title VI Standard Assurance language into their Public Work's Standard Public Work/Personal Service contract.

The Public Works Department also continues to include the Title VI Non-Discrimination statement in their invitations to bid, request for proposals, and request for qualifications. This statement notifies all bidders that we will affirmatively insure that, in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, national origin or sex in consideration for an award.

5. Summarize any transportation projects that identify potential impacts to minority and/or low-income Environmental Justice (EJ) populations (i.e., impacts such as displacements, increased noise, bisecting neighborhoods, et al).

Franklin County did not have any transportation projects that identified potential impacts to minority or low-income Environmental Justice (EJ) populations during this reporting period.

6. If Right-of-Way has been acquired for a transportation project, please describe:

Franklin County acquired right-of-way from five (5) landowners for the Pasco-Kahlotus Road Reconstruction and Overlay II project.

Right-of-way for the Pasco-Kahlotus Reconstruction/Overlay II project consist of acquiring strip takes along an existing rural road. The project aims to widen the existing road and reconstruct a section of the roadway's vertical profile to meet current design standards. Right-of-way was acquired from five (5) landowners.

All efforts taken to date have been in accordance with the WSDOT-approved right-of-way procurement policies and procedures. Franklin County Public Works has consulted with a right-of—way consultant that specializes in the acquisition of the appraisal, appraisal review, and acquisition of property.

The above mentioned project has been adopted through multiple successive six-year transportation improvement programs (TIPs), most recently in 2019. A public hearing has been held prior to the adoption of each of these programs. The public hearing was published in both English and Spanish and a Spanish translator was available, if needed. To date, no concerns from minorities or women have been raised with the County regarding any of these projects listed in the current TIP.

7. List and describe any Title VI related complaints, as a result of transportation activities and projects.

No complaints relating to Title VI were received as a result of transportation activities and projects by Franklin County during this reporting period.
