Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting and Public Hearing to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

9:01 a.m. **Approval of Minutes**

September 24, 2019 Commissioners' Meeting Minutes were approved as presented.

9:01 a.m. Certificate of Appreciation – 4 Wheel Drive Association

Citizens Doug Conner and Earl Nettnin from the 4 Wheel Drive Association presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Commissioner Peck for working on the Juniper Dunes access Road. They also acknowledged Commissioner Koch's involvement.

9:03 a.m. Public Hearing- Amending Public Records Request Fee Schedule

Commissioner Koch opened the Public Hearing amending the Public Records request fee schedule.

County Administrator Keith Johnson stated the last fee schedule was implemented in 2009. The request is due to the increase of electronic records and trying to sustain the cost of providing these records. Paper fees would remain the same.

Commissioner Koch opened the hearing for public comment. With no comments from the public, the public hearing was closed at 9:05a.m.

9:08 a.m. Franklin County Holiday Policy Update

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave presented an updated Holiday policy to the Board. The discussion included whether Unions agreed to this update and comparison of standard holiday dates with other private and public sectors.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2019-304 as presented. Commissioner Didier seconded and the motion carried.

9:15 a.m. Preliminary 2020 Franklin County Budget Submission

Director of Finance Thomas C. Westerman and Accounting Supervisor Tim Anderson presented the highlights of the 2020 General Fund Preliminary Budget.

- There is a Preliminary Budget deficit of (\$1,646,864)
- Overall revenues are \$32,832,244 a decrease of \$817,756 or 2.4% under FY 2019.
- Overall expenditures are \$34,479,108, an increase of \$829,108 or 2.5% over 2019.
- Salaries and Benefits increased \$385,949 or 1.95%. This figure does not include a 2020 COLA.
- Contracts to negotiate for 2020 are Courthouse, Roads, Appraisers and Sheriff/Clerical.
- Requests for Expenditure increases total \$3,164,189. Of this, \$643,521 is for 7 new positions.
- Capital requests totaled \$1,555,834. \$1,047,995 is for Corrections.
- Fund balances are at \$3,260,900 for Beginning and \$1,600,000 for Ending. (2019-\$3.2M/\$2.2M)
- Budget Workshops will be held October 22-25, 2019.
- Public Hearing to adopt the Final Budget will be held on December 3, 2019.
