#### 9:01 a.m. **Administration Office Business**

County Administrator Keith Johnson reviewed the Governors orders to stay home except for essential personnel. This would limit the staff at the courthouse and members of the public to enter the courthouse, thus keeping everyone as safe as possible. Members of the public may call to schedule an appointment if phone and online services are not sufficient to do essential business.

Then Governors website lists "essential" workers. Agriculture and limited building, such as new construction are considered essential at this time.

Mr. Johnson is being updated frequently from state and local healthcare providers and emergency personnel.

The public may still go to grocery stores as needed, and go for walks or biking while keeping a social distance of six feet or more.

Due to the COVID 19 virus, the Commissioners meeting does not have a means to meet the requirements for a public hearing under the public voting rights act, which was scheduled for County Commissioners redistricting. Because of time restraints, notices, and requirements that are in place, the redistricting is forced to delay until the 2020 census is finished.

#### 9:14 a.m. Public Comment

- Jeffery Robinson thanked the Commissioners for taking precautions and treating the virus seriously.
- Assessor Peter McEnderfer has two people in the office and the others are working remotely. He thanked Information Services team for the outstanding job and smooth transition that took place in order for coworkers to work from home.

The Assessor's office will set appointments from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m. if necessary. The best way to do business is through mail, phone or email.



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Keith Johnson also expressed his appreciation for Information Services as well as Facilities, Corrections and Law Enforcement. He encouraged the public to be considerate of the social distancing for Law Enforcement and others.

Commissioner Peck highlighted the Governors directives included financial matters. The Treasurer's Office, Auditor's Office and Assessor's Office are key components to ensuring the financial matters in the county continue. He thanked them for their support in this process.
