Summary / Background Information

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Chair of the Board of Benton County Commissioners and the Chair of the Board of Franklin County Commissioners be and they hereby are authorized to sign, on behalf of their respective county, the Professional Services Contract Amendment No. 1 between Benton Franklin Counties Juvenile Justice Center and Lutheran Community Services Northwest for a consideration amount not to exceed \$75,000.00; and

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT AMENDMENT NO. 1

This Contract Amendment No. 1 is made and entered into by and between Benton County, a political subdivision, with its principal offices at 620 Market Street, Prosser, WA 99350 and Franklin County, a political subdivision, with its principal offices at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, WA 99301, by and for the Benton-Franklin Counties Juvenile Justice Center, a bi-county agency located at 5606 W. Canal Place STE 106, Kennewick, WA 99336 (hereinafter collectively referred to as "Counties"), and Lutheran Community Services Northwest, 4040 South 188th Street, Suite 300, SeaTac, WA 98188 (hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR").

In consideration of the mutual benefits and covenants contained herein and in the parties' contract, numbered as Benton County Resolution No. 2020 452 executed on July 14, 2020 and Franklin County Resolution No. 2020 142 executed on June 23, 2020 (the "Contract"), the parties agree to amend the Contract as follows:

- 1. Section 3 of the Contract ("Services Provided"), shall be amended in its entirety to include additional services to be provided, and shall read:
 - a. The CONTRACTOR will provide Functional Family Therapy (FFT) to youth referred by the Counties in accordance with the FFT model. This includes, but is not limited to:
 - 1. Concepts and practice contained in the most recent Blueprints for Violence Prevention: Functional Family Therapy.
 - 2. Providing eligible moderate to high-risk youth and families with an average of twelve (12) sessions of family therapy that focuses on identifying obtainable goals and developing a behavior change program for the family.
 - Acceptance of Clinical Guidance as supplied by FFT, Inc, including engaging with the FFT
 Consultant in formal telephonic and in-person consultation as determined by the FFT
 Consultant.
 - 4. Entry and monitoring of FFT clinical assessments and subsequent treatment plans of youth through FFT case-reporting system.
 - 5. Providing FFT services in accordance with the FFT model and the Washington State FFT Project Quality Assurance and Improvement System/Plan, which is attached as Exhibit A to

this Contract and incorporated herein by reference. This includes but is not limited to: the concepts and practice contained in the Functional Family Therapy Clinical Training Manual; the general precepts, practice, and assessment procedures contained in FFT Initial three-day training and the three two-day follow-up trainings.

6. Providing progress information on each youth/family served by the Contractor under this Contract as follows:

Upon completion of each FFT session the Contractor will send a written status report to the youth's Juvenile Probation Counselor (JPC).

No later than the 5th of each month, the Contractor will submit a written Session List to the Intervention Services Manager for each youth served under this Contract for the prior month, and upon successful completion or termination of a family from FFT services, the Contractor will submit a written final report to the Intervention Services Manager.

- 7. Participate in mutually agreed upon case staffing and program review meetings.
- 8. Maintain an approved level of proficiency with the FFT model as evaluated by the assigned FFT Consultant and the Juvenile Court Administrator.
- 9. Provide information on each FFT therapist's model adherence to the appropriate regional contact.
- b. Additional FFT requirements include but are not limited to:
 - 1. Youth served under this Contract shall be under the jurisdiction of the Benton-Franklin Counties Juvenile Justice Center during the FFT intervention. To assist in this supervision, the Contractor shall share pertinent information with the Counties and shall safeguard electronic and hard copy client information.
 - 2. The Contractor shall meet monthly with the Counties' Intervention Prevention Service Manager or designee for program review.
 - 3. Prior to services being initiated, the Contractor must receive a written referral for services by the Counties.
- c. The Contractor agrees to accept up to a full caseload of FFT clients on behalf of the Benton-Franklin Juvenile Justice Center.
- d. The CONTRACTOR shall provide brief family counseling provided to educate and support families dealing with family violence.

Steps Involved:

- CONTRACTOR contacts referred family within one business day of referral.
- 2. Counseling sessions will take place in either the families' homes, or in an office setting. The location of the session will be based upon the referred families' preferences.
- 3. The length of the counseling sessions will be between 60-120 minutes.
- 4. CONTRACTOR will work with each family between 5-7 sessions and the intervention will take place over a 4-6 week period dependent upon the needs of the family.

- 5. The model utilized by the CONTRACTOR will be solution/focused strength based family therapy models. Skill building among family members will specifically address maladaptive patterns that lead to violence.
- 6. Prior to case completions a crisis plan will be submitted, re-evaluated and shared with the juvenile probation counselor. The juvenile probation counselor and the CONTRACTOR will work with every family to identify natural and community supports. Referrals will then be made to the appropriate resources.
- e. The CONTRACTOR agrees to provide its own labor and materials. Unless otherwise provided in this Contract, no material, labor, or facilities will be furnished by the COUNTIES.
- f. The Contractor acknowledges that prior to entering into this Contract it is in receipt of, and is (familiar with, the FFT model, practices, procedures, materials, and training referenced herein.
- g. The CONTRACTOR shall perform the work specified in this Contract according to standard industry practice.
- h. The CONTRACTOR shall complete its work in a timely manner and in accordance with the schedule agreed by the parties.
- i. The CONTRACTOR shall confer with the COUNTIES from time to time during the progress of the work. The CONTRACTOR shall prepare and present status reports and other information that may be pertinent and necessary, or as requested by the COUNTIES.
- 2. Section 5 of the Contract ("Compensation"), shall be amended in its entirety to amend compensation rate, and shall read:
 - a. For the services performed under this Contract, the CONTRACTOR shall be paid as follows: At the rate \$733.33 per family for the completion of each phase of the three (3) phase FFT Model, including engagement and motivation, behavior change and generalization, for a maximum of \$2200.00 per family for completion of all three (3) phases including additional hours for ancillary duties (as described by the FFT Model).
 - b. For the services performed under this Contract, the CONTRACTOR shall be paid for brief family counseling at the rate of \$50.00 per hour, not to exceed 2 hours per session, seven (7) sessions per family, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Intervention Services Manager.
 - c. The maximum total amount payable by the COUNTIES to the CONTRACTOR under this Contract shall not exceed Seventy Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00).
 - d. No payment shall be made for any work performed by the CONTRACTOR, except for work identified and set forth in this Contract.
 - e. The CONTRACTOR may submit invoices to the COUNTIES not more than once per month during the progress of the work for partial payment of the work completed to date. Invoices shall cover the time CONTRACTOR performed work for the COUNTIES during the billing period. The COUNTIES shall pay the CONTRACTOR for services rendered in the month following the actual delivery of work and will remit payment within thirty (30) days from the date of receipt of the invoice.
 - f. The CONTRACTOR shall not be paid for services rendered under this Contract unless and until they have been performed to the satisfaction of the COUNTIES.

- g. In the event the CONTRACTOR has failed to perform any substantial obligation to be performed by the CONTRACTOR under this Contract and such failure has not been cured within ten (10) days following notice from the COUNTIES, the COUNTIES may, in its sole discretion, upon written notice to the CONTRACTOR, withhold any and all monies due and payable to the CONTRACTOR, without penalty, until such failure to perform is cured or otherwise adjudicated. "Substantial" for the purposes of this Contract means faithfully fulfilling the terms of this Contract with variances only for technical or minor omissions or defects.
- h. Unless otherwise provided in this Contract or any exhibits or attachments hereto, the CONTRACTOR will not be paid for any billings or invoices presented for services rendered prior to the execution of this Contract or after its termination.

Except as expressly provided in this Contract Amendment No.1, all other terms and conditions of the original Contract and subsequent written contract amendments thereto remain in full force and effect.

This Amendment shall be effective July 1, 2020 and shall expire June 30, 2022.
