#### 9:11 a.m. Administration Office Business

- Administrator Keith Johnson brought forth a request from the Coastal Conservation Association in which Franklin County would send a letter to the Washington Fish and Wildlife Commission in regards to regulations with harvest management.
  - \* After discussion, the Commissioners agreed to sign the letter and send another letter as a follow up to address other issues of concern.

#### 9:16 a.m. **Public Comment**

• Juan Morales voiced his concerns about Governor Inslee's meeting at Columbia Basin College with local officials and believed all Commissioners should have had the opportunity to attend. He was concerned as to the ethics of this action.

### 9:20 a.m.

• Administrator Keith Johnson brought forth a request from the Liberty State with the approximate cost of \$4,000 to place the advisory vote on the ballot.

After discussion, the Commissioners agreed to ascertain more information before moving forward.

- Administrator Keith Johnson is working with Karl Dye to finalize details on the CARES Act Funding and its distribution through TRIDEC.
- Commissioner Didier had some concerns regarding the destruction of political signs. He asked the Sheriff if he would enforce the law in regards to this matter.

He also wanted to know how tax collection was doing in the county. Treasurer Josie Koelzer responded that tax collection is going well. They are currently at 57%.

He asked Auditor Matt Beaton for a percentage of returned election ballots to date. Mr. Beaton stated 11% currently, which is similar to previous elections.

9:39 a.m. Commissioner Didier relayed the decision of the U.S. District Court of Western Washington, which denied a lawsuit against the Governor. Stating, he cannot be sued over his proclamation since he does not enforce it. His authority lies with issuance, not enforcement.

Prosecuting Attorney Shawn Sant rebutted this statement and clarified the reasoning behind the ruling. The Governors proclamation is legal and binding. Other entities enforce the law such as law enforcement and the prosecuting attorney's office would review any offence. The Attorney General has the authority to take action if he sees fit. Although Mr. Sant does not agree with the Governors' orders, he still stands by his recommendation to the county, to comply with the proclamation.

### 9:58 a.m. **Public Comment**

- Jeffery Robinson asked Commissioners to clarify when they are acting on behalf of the county or their own business. He also asked for professionalism from the Board towards other electeds.
- Michelle Andres agreed with Mr. Robinson on actions of unprofessionalism and divisive behavior being used in the Commissioners meetings. She asked that the division stop.
