- Water and Sewer services are in close proximity to that area. Water services are available from Road 48, while sewer services are available on Road 44. (See Appendix D for maps of current water and sewer locations)
- Franklin PUD and Charter Cable already utilize the easement for services.
- The extension of Dradie Street would also be a logical connection between Road 44 and Road 48.
- Vacating the existing right-of-way could negatively impact future development in the area.
