9:36 a.m. HAPO Center Energy Audit Presentation

Mr. Johnson introduced the McKinstry group that presented the PowerPoint. Christie Hoffpauer, Lance Funke, and Scott McGann were the representatives from McKinstry.

Ms. Hoffpauer started the presentation with the purpose of doing the energy audit, the brief overview of the utility data analysis and performance standards. Currently there are some grants, credits and funding available to assist with the capital improvements. Stiff penalties will be enforced on those who do not comply with the new state regulations. She reviewed the energy and financial implications of not being in compliance.



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Lance Funke brought forth the draft preliminary proposal, which included the following:

Fee for audit is eighty-five thousand dollars.
