• George Dockstader did not think it was appropriate to have individual meetings with the Coleville Tribe. He stated it should be an open meeting. He proposed a larger portion of tax be diverted to help with mental health program. He wanted to know where ARPA funds are being spent, where do we stand with redistricting, and where do we stand with the Growth Management Act.

Commissioner Mullen met with Mr. Billy Gunn from the Colville tribe to hear him as a member of the public. He then invited Mr. Gunn to come before the Board to present his information if he so desired.

Commissioner Peck deemed it not a good idea to meet individually with the Colville tribe. He mentioned that our attorneys are the best source for inquiring information regarding redistricting.

The tribe initially requested to come before the Board and Administrator Keith Johnson thought it be a good idea for them to meet with the Commissioners individually. He will contact the tribe to cancel the individual meeting and allow them time to speak before the Board Meeting.

Mr. Johnson replied to the Growth Management Act question by stating they have submitted a response to the hearings board and have not heard back as of yet. The City of Kennewick had a similar case and were successful in the outcome.

- George Dockstader said everyone should have the chance to speak before the Board.
- Johns Rose gave information on WHO World Health Organization's essential medicines list. Ivermectin was on the list of essentials, however, it was ignored, vilified or censored during the covid pandemic.
