George Dockstader mentioned the City of Pasco has invited public comment on traffic issues on road 68 and 100. He proposes a bridge in north Pasco. He was concerned with inflation and asked the Board to consider the possibility for some of the ARPA money be set aside for COLA's for employees next year.

#### 9:15 a.m. Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation Presentation

Natural Resources Director Cody Desautel opened the presentation with introductions to himself, Pasco Economic Development Project Contract Attorney Alice Koskela and Pasco Economic Development Project Manager Billy Gunn. He turned the time over to Ms. Koskela.

She gave a background of the purchase of the property located near King City in East Pasco. She spoke of the agreements with Pasco City Council and a letter of intent with the Franklin PUD. They were looking for a cooperation agreement with Franklin County to deal with guidelines for agreements in the future.

Cody Desautel explained the trust procedures and the changes that will take place. The deed of trust application will take approximately 2-5 years to complete.

Billy Gunn explained that they are planning to attend the Cinco de Mayo celebration in Pasco with tribal dancers and drummers. Mr. Gunn will keep the Commissioners apprised of information as it takes place.

Michelle M. Holt, Executive Director of Benton-Franklin Council of Governments gave a background of the BFCOG Organization. It was established by voluntary association of local units of government in 1966. The jurisdictions are outlined below.

Collaboratively they plan, fund and administer solutions to shared community needs.
