- Citizen complaints on H2A Housing Program. This is temporary housing for farm laborers and it is under the department of Labor and Industries. Franklin County does not have any jurisdiction over them. Planning and Building Director Derrick Braaten gave a background on the issue.

9:26 a.m. **Hanford Communities Update**

Executive Director David Reeploeg gave a brief background of the Hanford Communities program, which was formed in 1994.

Their objectives:

- Coordinate local government involvement on Hanford issues.
- Increase public awareness and involvement in Hanford cleanup issues
- Advocate for community priorities
- Provide technical and analytical resources to review, evaluate and monitor conditions and policies at Hanford.

He introduced the Governing and Administrative Boards. He then spoke of the 2021 Review with Cleanup process at the Tank B-109 leak, 324 Building stabilization, K basin, 100 K Area and K East Reactor prep for "cocooning".

Mr. Reeploeg then spoke of the priorities and cleanup projects during 2022.
