Based on the Census results, Franklin County drew up various map options of redistricting with committee input and began public hearings for additional input of the options. The Redistricting Committee met multiple times both as a committee and in the public hearings to bring forth map proposals. These public hearings took place on October 12th, 13th and 14th and November 15th of 2021, both in Spanish and in English. An additional public hearing was January 11th for comment prior to the Board voting on a map. **RECOMMENDATION:** Approve the resolution. WHEREAS, a public hearing was held January 11, 2022, to take testimony for and against the adoption of Commissioners' redistricting plan; and


WHEREAS, current boundaries were set for commissioners' districts March 19, 2014, by Resolution 2014-120; and

Commissioner Mullen update

- Ben Franklin Transit- replacement of operations building
- Received calls and concerns with ending contract between Lourdes and Greater Columbia Behavior Health. Lourdes has provided help for over 40 years and deserves an explanation.
- Thanked the Redistricting Committee for all the time and effort they put into this process. Thanked demographer Dr. Morrison for reviewing the maps. His recommendation for Franklin County, and the only map that he recommended was Map #2. Commissioner Mullen took a lot of public scrutiny for being the only one to choose map #2. He believes in having fair representation to all of Franklin County and map #2 represents that equity.
- Commissioner Peck answered Commissioner Mullen's question on GCBH Termination. It
 was a termination for convenience. Commissioner Peck suggested contacting Mr. Jim Bell, the
 attorney over this contract. Commissioner Peck specifically abstained from the vote to cancel
 the contract, due to having other county contracts with Lourdes and the perceived conflict of
 interest.

Commissioner Didier update

- Ben Franklin Operation of Maintenance- proposed destruction of their building and rebuild at a cost of 17 million dollars.
- Meeting tonight with the Assessor to answer any questions you might have on taxes. The
 meeting will be held at 12901 North Glade Road 7p.m.
- Commissioner Didier was in opposition of 246-100 WAC.

9:36 a.m. Public Comment

- Dr. Raul Garcia concerned with termination of Greater Columbia Behavior Health contract.
 He asked for the reason behind the termination.
- Joan White Wagner CEO of Lourdes Medical Center received termination letter on Thursday.
 The reason stated was that they were going in a different direction. She believed that this was a mislead termination. It effects approximately 80% of Lourdes work services.
- Jeffery Robinson inquired as to whether the meetings were official due to Commissioners not wearing masks. He voiced concerns on HB 1750 and its possible effects on agriculture.
- Steve Bauman thanked Commissioner Peck on the continuation of representation with our local resources (possible new nuclear power resource). COOL- Country of Origin Labeling is of great concern and is not true representation of the origin. Concerned with the termination of Lourdes contract and asked the Commissioners to look into it.
- Michelle Andres asked the Commissioners to look into NEPA- National Environmental Policy Act training.

9:51 a.m. OPEN PUBLIC HEARING Redistricting Map

Commissioner Didier continued the open public hearing by turning the time over to demographer Dr. Peter Morrison. Dr. Morrison gave a quick overview of option #2 and alternative #2A maps. He recommended either of the #2 plans for a Hispanic influenced district. He did not recommend 1, 3 and 4 as they were flawed by packing and cracking.

Dr. Morrison answered the Commissioners questions on the two #2 maps.

- James Follansbee still in favor of #4 map with revisions.
- Jeffery Robinson thanked the demographer for his work but disagreed with his recommendation. He prefers the plaintiffs map.
- Steve Bauman was thankful for the local process and was grateful is does not go directly to the Supreme Court for outside entities to make a decision. He was disappointed that the demographer's information was not given to the public sooner.

- George Dockstader sat on the Redistricting Committee for five months and stated, it takes time
 to put all of the information together. He requested at large voting in the general elections.
- Lupe Cardenas was a member of the Redistricting Committee asked Dr. Morrison if the data
 used was the 2020 census. Dr. Morrison explained that the 2020 census covers population, not
 citizens. ACS-American Community Survey is based on citizens, which runs continuously (the
 latest data is from 2019). He supports districts in primary and at large for general election.
- Prosecuting Attorney Shawn Sant gave the Board options to vote on #2, 2A or open it up to additional Public Hearings.

10:45 a.m. Commissioner Didier closed the open public hearing.

- Commissioner Peck feels that committee should have the opportunity to craft another map or reworking an existing map.
- Commissioner Mullen has no objection to having the committee look at map #2 or #2A.
- Commissioner Didier thanked the committee for their services, however, the demographer gave his recommendation and he supports his expertise in this matter.
- Commissioner Didier asked members of the committee to weigh in on whether they would like to look at map #2 and #2A.
- Lupe Cardenas is fine with #2 or #2A, or if the committee would like to meet, he would be able to do that as well.
- George Dockstader did not feel like it was the committee's job to tweak the maps.
- Jeffery Robinson agreed with Commissioner Didier, that we need to choose a map and let the courts decide what will happen with the maps.
- George Dockstader let the Board know that when the Committee met with the demographer earlier, they liked map #2 and map #4 with a few tweaks that would make it compliant. He thanked everyone involved, as they were very helpful.
- Steve Bauman agreed that if there were no immediate deadline to choose a map, perhaps taking a bit more time to decide would be helpful.
- Shawn Sant suggested the Board choose sooner than later.
 - Commissioner Mullen moved to approve map #2 as presented. Commissioner Peck seconded and the motion carried.
