7:14 p.m. **Public Comment**

- Assistant to the Prosecuting Attorney Kelly Schadler discussed the email that was given to the Commissioners on vehicle allowance discrepancies. She thought the report was well done, however she was not given any notification that there was a problem, or that the policy of reporting had been changed. She displayed documentation of what she had been doing for fifteen years and was not aware of the change in processing payments.
- Prosecuting Attorney Shawn Sant received the email on vehicle allowance discrepancies as well and pulled the paystubs to verify overpayment. It appears that there was an overpayment and he contacted the Attorney General to have them look into this matter, as the W2 form and paystub do not reconcile. He also asked the State Auditor's Office to look into the matter.

He also clarified an alluded wrongdoing back in 2012 with car allowance. He stated that elected officials did take action and made needed corrections.

- Assistant to the Prosecuting Attorney Kelly Schadler respectfully asked the Commissioners to inquire as to the length of time for the Auditor to find and report this issue.
- George Dockstader voiced his concern with the Auditor.
