SUBJECT: Surplus declaration of county owned property, through the 1. Motor Vehicle (ER&R) Fund, 2. Franklin County Road Fund, 3. Franklin County Sheriff's Department, and 4. HAPO Center, and authorization for disposition via Public Auction, Recycle, or Disposal.

FISCAL IMPACT: This action will provide revenue through the disposition of county owned property. Upon the Public Auction, Recycle, or Disposal of the county property owned by the Motor Vehicle (ER&R) Fund, the Franklin County Road Fund, the Franklin County Sheriff's Department, and the HAPO Center, all proceeds shall be deposited into the appropriate fund, in accordance with 36.33A.050 RCW, and 36.34.120 RCW, as applicable.

BACKGROUND:

A Notice of Public Hearing was published pursuant to 36.34.020 RCW in the official paper for Franklin County in both the English and Spanish language. An Affidavit of Publication is held in the file at the Public Works Administration Office.

The Public Hearing for this matter was held February 28, 2023. No members of the public spoke for or against the declaration of surplus.

During discussion of the proposed resolution, the Commission requested additional information regarding the usage of auction services in the local area. The research conducted by the Franklin County Fleet Manager, Greg Snyder, has been attached to this Agenda Summary Report and incorporated herein by reference.

Therefore, we request that the following subject items owned by Franklin County be declared surplus:

1. The following items were purchased through the Motor Vehicle (ER&R) Fund, which is part of the County's equipment rental and revolving fund, enshrined in Chapter 36.33A RCW. These items have reached the end of their useful service life.

FRANKLIN COUNTY RESOLUTION

BEFORE THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY WASHINGTON

DECLARING COUNTY-OWNED PROPERTY AS SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZATION OF DISPOSITION VIA PUBLIC AUCTION, RECYCLE, OR DISPOSAL

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Public Works Department maintains a fleet of vehicles, equipment, and miscellaneous items in support of operations through the Motor Vehicle (ER&R) Fund, including: 1–100 Gallon Bulk Fuel Tank, Serial #098251, 1–Conveyor System, no identification numbers or markings, 14–Broom Cores, 1–WY-2692 Tenco Snow Plow, 8– Studded tires and wheels, 5–Passenger tires, and 2–Heavy equipment wheels and tires; and

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Public Works maintains vehicles, equipment, and miscellaneous items in support of operations through the County Road Fund, including a small utility trailer #TR-1454, serial WN71721014, 2-sand spreaders ID #WY-2732 and #WY-2772, a cold patch spreader, serial #42301, and 1-box of miscellaneous John Deere parts; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with RCW 36.33A.030, the Board of Franklin County Commissioners have appointed the Public Works Director/County Engineer as the administrator of the Motor Vehicle (ER&R) Fund and the County Road Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Public Works Director/County Engineer has determined the equipment and miscellaneous items listed above, to have reached the end of their useful life for county purposes, and that the sale of said items, through public auction, recycle, or disposal, to be the most cost effective for the county; and

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Sheriff's Department maintains a fleet of vehicles, through the County Sheriff Fund, including a 2015 Ford Explorer, ID #CS-1510, VIN #1FM5K8AT1FGC52309, 2013 Chevy Tahoe, ID #CS-1332, VIN #1GNLC2E02DR337884, 2013 Chevy Tahoe, ID #CS-1334, VIN #1GNLC2E05DR338690, 2017 Ford Explorer, ID #CS-1705, VIN #1FM5K8AT1HGD26587, 2003 Econoline Van, ID #CS-1603, VIN #1FMNE31L43HB42709, and a 2013 Chevy Tahoe, ID #CS-1311, VIN #1GNLC2E04DR337420; and

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Sheriff has determined the vehicles, listed above, to have reached the end of their useful life for County purposes, and that the sale of said vehicles, through public auction, to be the most cost effective for the county; and

WHEREAS, the HAPO Center maintains vehicles, equipment, and miscellaneous items in support of operations, including 1-Clark Forklift, serial #F386112, 1 – Blue Zamboni, serial HDB1582/TRAC #00432, 1–Ground Master Blower, no serial #, 1–TCM Forklift, Serial #A23T41685/FG25N3T, 1–New Holland Tractor, serial #Y1403149 / 17LA, 1–Sky Scissor Lift, serial #P232L-0483-9645, 1–John Deere Tractor, TRAC #01109, 3–Sets of Aluminum Bleachers, 4–Sun Signs, 2–TRAC Signs, 52–Rolls (50,000 Sq. feet) rollup flooring; and

WHEREAS, the HAPO Center has determined the equipment and miscellaneous items listed above, to have reached the end of their useful life for county purposes, and that the sale of said items, through public auction, recycle, or disposal, to be the most cost effective for the county; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Franklin County Commissioners held a public hearing, in accordance with RCW 36.34, upon the proposal to dispose of county property at the day and hour fixed in the notice at its usual

place of business, and admitted evidence offered for and against the propriety and advisability of the proposed action; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Franklin County Commissioners constitutes the legislative authority of Franklin County and finds that the surplus and disposal of the subject county owned property as being in the best interest of Franklin County; and

WHERAS, funds recovered from the public auction, recycle, or disposal of the county property owned by the Motor Vehicle (ER&R) Fund, the County Road Fund, the Franklin County Sheriff's Department, and the HAPO Center shall be deposited into the appropriate fund, in accordance with RCW 36.33A.050, and RCW 36.34.120.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Franklin County Commissioners declare the subject county property as surplus, and authorize the Public Works Director/County Engineer to execute the disposition of the property via Public Auction, Recycle, or Disposal, and to therefore have the County Auditor remove the property, as may be applicable, from the inventory list for the Motor Vehicle (ER&R) Fund, the County Road Fund, the County Sheriff's Department, and the HAPO Center.

Auction Selection Process (Expanded)

Washington Surplus. Visited the website to see what kind of Auctions they provided. After going through the site I determined they only held Auctions for small collectables and similar items, no vehicles or equipment.

Vail International. Visited this website as well. After confirming that they did sell larger items such as cars, trucks and equipment, I checked the online reviews to find they have very bad reviews. I went in to double check the review process a few days ago to find they have not changed and may be a little more negative. I do not feel Franklin County Should take a chance on some of the negative things that were said about them.

Trucks Auto Auction. In the spring of 2019 I received a call from Jake Musser (I believe is his name) He was presenting his Auction to me to see if Franklin County would be interested in using the Auction. After he gave me the details, I let him know we would be very interested in trying them out. I asked him if they were on a State Contract or Sourcewell contract. He told me they had a contract with Franklin County as they had sold property for us in the past. I let him know I would like to have a copy of that contract and an agreement that I could look over. I told him we would have equipment for auction in November and if he got back to me I would like to get the process started. I never heard back from him.

In the spring of 2021 he called me again and asked the same questions with the same response as before, the only difference is I reminded him we had this conversation before and he never followed up. I let him know we would have equipment again in November and he needed to get back to me with some information to get started. Again that was the last time I spoke with him.

A-Jacks Auction. As we do business with A-Jacks Towing and Body Shop I am aware of their Auction were they sell cars and trucks. We usually sell a lot more than just vehicles and really do not like to split it up especially since we already do business with them. The cost of splitting it up verses streamlining does not make sense to me.

Rad Towing. I never considered using them I just listed them as they were one of the local Auction houses. They seem to just Auction vehicles that they Repo.

Bookers Auction. As stated in my summary Booker Auction will sell everything we have for surplus. I have worked with them many times and they always keep me informed of the whole process. Camille Booker contacts me in the spring and early fall to see if we have any surplus to auction off. As stated in my summary we usually get pretty good compensation for the goods we send there.

Note: On Monday February 27th I received and email from Craig Erdman from WSAC. The email contained information regarding WSAC Partners With Public Surplus. I have since been researching the program and feel it can be a great benefit to Franklin County Public Works. I am in the process of getting the 30 minute presentation they have for this service. Just an FYI.
