COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

Public Hearing: To take testimony for and against increasing the revenue and expenditure bottom lines of the 2007 Current Expense Sheriff Budget #001-000-520 by \$300,000 due to anticipated revenue received from the security contract with the Port of

County Administrator Fred Bowen met with the Board.

<u>Pasco</u>

Public Hearing convened at 9:05 a.m. Present: Commissioners Corkrum, Koch and Brock; County Administrator Fred Bowen; Sheriff Richard Lathim; and Clerk to the Board Mary Withers. Present in audience: Benton County Commissioner Leo Bowman, Commissioner-Elect Rick Miller, TRAC Finance Manager Shannon Jones and Undersheriff Kevin Carle.

Mr. Bowen said the resolution would increase the Sheriff's budget by \$300,000 in order for the Sheriff's Department to do security work at the airport.

Mrs. Corkrum asked if the contract has been completed. Sheriff Lathim said
Chief Civil Deputy Prosecutor Ryan Verhulp and the port have worked out the language.
Sheriff Lathim's concerns, Prosecutor Steve Lowe's concerns, and the Port of Pasco's concerns have been addressed with revisions in the contract. The contract should be ready next week.

Mrs. Corkrum said the \$300,000 figure is a little bit more than the figure that the contract specifies. Sheriff Lathim said the contract states that the county will collect \$251,500 in 2007 from the Port of Pasco. He wanted the Board to know that no more than that will be collected in 2007. Mrs. Corkrum said the \$300,000 will give us some cushion if something comes up. The other Board members agreed. Mr. Koch said he wants everyone to realize that the total amount that can be spent is only what the contract reads.

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Mrs. Corkrum asked three times if anyone in the audience is opposed to this budget increase. There was no response.

Mrs. Corkrum asked three times if anyone in the audience is in favor of the increase to the Sheriff's budget. There was no response.

Hearing was closed to public comment.

<u>Motion</u> – Mr. Brock: I move the approval of Resolution 2006-625 regarding an increase of revenue and expenditure bottom lines of the 2007 Current Expense Sheriff Budget as specified. Second by Mr. Koch. 3:0 vote in favor.

Public Hearing: To take testimony for and against increasing the revenue and expenditure bottom lines of the 2006 Miscellaneous TRAC Operations Fund #404-000-001 by \$360,000 due to a transfer of funds from the Current Expense Non-Departmental Cumulative Reserve (Rainy Day) Fund #001-000-700

Public Hearing convened at 9:10 a.m. Present: Commissioners Corkrum, Koch and Brock; County Administrator Fred Bowen; and TRAC Finance Manager Shannon Jones. Present in audience: Sheriff Richard Lathim, Undersheriff Kevin Carle, Benton County Commissioner Leo Bowman, Commissioner-Elect Rick Miller, Secretary Patricia Shults, Tri-City Herald Reporter Joe Chapman, Chief Accountant Tom Westerman and Planning Director Jerrod MacPherson.

Mr. Bowen said the increase is to cover expenditures and to add revenues to cover the expenditures. The proposed resolution will clean up some errors in bookkeeping that were brought to our attention last week. Mr. Bowen anticipates there will be some more transfers after additional bookkeeping and secretarial work is completed next week regarding the \$200,000 cash flow amount that was put into the TRAC budget earlier. The current resolution will cover the shortage so the bills can be paid for the 2006 year.

Mrs. Corkrum asked three times if anyone in the audience would like to speak against this resolution. There was no response.

Mrs. Corkrum asked three times if anyone in the audience would like to speak in favor. There was no response.

Hearing was closed to public comment.

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Motion – Mr. Brock: I move the approval of Resolution 2006-626 regarding the increase in the revenue and expenditure bottom lines of the 2006 Miscellaneous TRAC Operation budgets and authorize the Treasurer to transfer \$360,000 from the 2006 Current Expense Non-Departmental Budget #001-000-700, Cumulative Reserve line item, to the TRAC Operating Budget as specified therein. Public Hearing: To take testimony for and against changing the 2007 TRAC Operations

Fund Number 404-000-001 to Number 405-000-001 in an effort to separate bookkeeping from previous years

Public Hearing convened at 9:14 a.m. Present: Commissioners Corkrum, Koch and Brock; County Administrator Fred Bowen; and Clerk to the Board Mary Withers. Present in audience: Kevin Carle, Richard Lathim, Leo Bowman, Shannon Jones, Tom Westerman, Rick Miller, Pat Shults, Joe Chapman and Jerrod MacPherson.

Mr. Westerman said the state auditors were not in favor of the fund number change at the Exit Conference and did not understand the need for it. He said, however, that the Auditor's Office will go along with the change. Mrs. Corkrum said she assumes if we get official notice that the State Auditor's Office is not in favor, we'll stick with the original fund number. Mr. Brock and Mr. Koch said we'll rescind it if that occurs.

Mrs. Corkrum asked three times if anyone would like to speak against the proposal. There was no response.

Mrs. Corkrum asked if anyone would like to speak in favor. Shannon Jones spoke in favor. Mrs. Corkrum asked two more times if anyone would like to speak in favor. There was no response.

Mr. Koch said if we do have an adverse recommendation from the state auditor, he would want to rescind it. Mr. Brock said this is a process that we've looked at and talked about for years in order to find it easier to look at the TRAC books and tell where we are. He hopes they wouldn't find it wrong to go this way. Mr. Koch agrees.

Motion – Mr. Brock: I move the approval of Resolution 2006-627 as specified. Second by Mr. Koch. 3:0 vote in favor.

Coyote Ridge Prison Impacts Study

The County Administrator's weekly project status report was reviewed.

Statue in Rotunda: gold leaf work

Mr. Bowen said it will cost about \$8000 to do the gold leaf work on the statue. There are funds available in the Courthouse Restoration fund from grant money. The county has to show the project is complete and then the state will reimburse the money. We intend to gold leaf 100% of the base and do some antiquing work to match the rest of the rotunda area.

Laptop Computers

Some laptop computers are being purchased for the Sheriff's Department. The vendor had already purchased the laptops but does not have a Franklin County business license. Mr. Bowen said the concern is that we're buying things from a person that does not have a business license in Franklin County. The vendor will get a business license. However, the vouchers have already been prepared.

Mr. Fife has given the Board the 2007 Public Works Work Plan. He said the maintenance portion of the plan tells where chip sealing will be done and other work we're going to be doing in 2007.

Commercial Avenue/Tank Farm Road Extension: Needs Study and Location Analysis

Mr. Fife gave the Board a draft of the Needs Study and Location Analysis for a road extension near the tank farm and Highway 12. The area has a high potential for bad accidents but we have not experienced any accidents. The document is complete except for a traffic analysis that is being prepared by the Benton-Franklin Council of Governments (BFCoG). Mr. Fife said the proposal is different than the initial proposal but he believes all the parties can live with this.

Mrs. Corkrum asked if the state is thinking of building another interchange.

Mr. Fife explained what studies have been done in the past regarding the interchanges in the area. Some landowners in the area are anxious for an interchange to be built.

Mrs. Corkrum said the City of Pasco would like to see some of the land developed.

Mr. Fife said the Port of Pasco would like to have an interchange.

J-U-B Engineers will be making a presentation to the Board about the proposal.

Mr. Fife asked the Board members to let him know if they have concerns.

Sheriff's Vehicles

Sheriff Lathim said Mr. Fife was going to talk about the proposed loan for Sheriff's vehicles. Mr. Fife said he did not get the information yet. There is some money available through the state for the sheriff's vehicles. Mrs. Corkrum asked how much? Mr. Fife said it is pretty much whatever you want. It's a loan. Sheriff Lathim said he was

told the funding is available four times a year, with two times being in March and July. The timing will work out well for what we wanted to do. Mr. Fife said there are also some used cars available from Salt Lake City. Sheriff Lathim said you can borrow money for cars but only for the life of the car. Sheriff Lathim left the meeting.

The Board reviewed information regarding the Classification Review for the TRAC Sales Manager position. The salary was approved at no more than \$30,000 for

this position. TRAC Manager Troy Woody has recommended Grade 36 which starts out at \$28,000. The Classification Review Committee is also recommending the Grade 36. Mr. Brock said he feels the salary is low for the work required. Mr. Bowen said he reviewed existing positions at the Courthouse and it's comparable to what we're paying. Mr. Brock said he feels someone hired for a sales position can make a tremendous amount of money.

Mrs. Corkrum asked for an example of the comparable positions from Mr. Bowen. She feels it's hard to be fair with positions in the regular county workforce compared to positions at TRAC. Mr. Bowen said this position is not truly a full sales position because the person will be at the front desk but also doing some sales. The main function is not sales. Ms. Rumsey said the person in the position will be doing short-term local sales, working with clients that have less than 100 participants. The person will handle small sales jobs, which is a big difference compared to the other two sales people. In addition, the person will be assisting with some accounting functions. Mr. Koch said if we get into a position six months or a year from now and the person is excelling, we will have to adjust the salary.

Mrs. Corkrum said she would like to wait for the HayGroup evaluation of positions before proceeding.

Ms. Rumsey said the original grade recommendation by Troy Woody was going to be Grade 25. The recommendation came at Grade 36 instead of Grade 25.

Mr. Koch said he thinks the job title should be "Sales Manager/Office Assistant" rather than only "Sales Manager." Ms. Rumsey said we can change the job title to match the job description.

The Board had consensus approval to change the job title and go forward.

Mrs. Corkrum said a motion will be needed to approve the sales manager/assistant position at Grade 36 based on qualifications and experience.

Motion – Mr. Koch: I move that we accept the Classification Review Committee's recommendation on Grade 36 with the salary related to experience. Second by Mr. Brock. 3:0 vote in favor.

Elections Department

Elections Supervisor Diana Killian met with the Board. Present in audience: Rick Miller, <u>Tri-City Herald</u> Reporter Joe Chapman, Rosie H. Rumsey, and one other reporter.

Ms. Killian requested additional funds for the Elections Department. She explained the additional work that was required this year. It cost over \$53,000 just to pay the printers.

Mrs. Corkrum asked what did we budget initially. Ms. Killian looked at the budget to provide the figure.

Mrs. Corkrum asked so our total printing costs for the primary and general elections is over \$100,000? Ms. Killian said yes, for the ballots and envelopes. She bought all the envelopes in February in two-column format but had to buy more envelopes in a three-column format. The two-column envelopes can be used in the future for small elections.

Mr. Brock asked if vote-by-mail is more expensive. Ms. Killian said no. There were some start-up costs and some unknown costs. We have always had to pay for the ballots. The programming of the ballots is what is costing the most. It had to be contracted out this year. In the future, Ms. Killian will be able to do it herself.

Mrs. Corkrum asked if it would have been cheaper with three different ballots.

Ms. Killian shook her head no. Mrs. Corkrum asked why. Ms. Killian said the programming would have cost less but the printing would have been more because there would have been three ballots to print. Mrs. Corkrum thinks it would have been a smaller ballot.

Mr. Brock asked if there is any reimbursement available. Ms. Killian said the Franklin County PUD will pay a little bit, about a third of the cost.

Ms. Killian said there are no school elections in 2007.

Ms. Killian told the Board about some Voter Outreach activities. She had to order additional ballots because voters made a lot of mistakes so additional ballots had to be printed and duplicated.

Ms. Killian answered the Board's other questions. She is hopeful the budget will not be short in the future. The Board reviewed the 2007 budget figures.

Mr. Bowen suggested taking the funds from the Professional Services budget because it is a bottom line budget. He would not want to take it out of the Rainy Day fund. A resolution will be prepared.




