OFFICE BUSINESS

Secretary Bridgette Scott met with the Board.

He reported the punch list is being addressed again at the Annex. He hopes the work will be done in a couple of weeks. The morale of employees and the public has risen due to the new facility.

COUNTY ENGINEER

Engineer Tim Fife met with the Board.

<u>CRP 596 - R170 Landslide Area: Local Agency Agreement LA 6251, Supplement #1</u> <u>Motion</u> - Mr. Miller: I move for approval of the Resolution 2007-608 for the Local Agency Agreement LA 6251, Supplement Number 1, between Franklin County and Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) for CRP 596/R170 Landslide Area. Second by Mrs. Corkrum. 3:0 vote in favor.

Property Purchase from City of Connell

Tim Fife has asked the Chief Civil Deputy Attorney to review the property purchase agreement for the shop property in Connell. Mr. Bowen suggested using Rainy Day funds in the Current Expense budget to pay the full \$250,000 and have Public Works reimburse Rainy Day through a loan. Details on the loan will be worked out upon closing of the purchase.

Commercial Avenue/Tank Farm Road Extension Needs Study and Location Analysis

Mr. Fife gave the Board the Commercial Avenue/Tank Farm Road Extension Needs Study and Location Analysis dated September 2007. The Board reviewed the information provided.

Public Works Trust Fund (PWTF)

Mr. Fife has talked to Treasurer Tiffany Coffland about available funds. The second 1/4% Excise Tax Fund, Number 168-000-001, receives about \$200,000 per year for capital improvements on County Roads. Mr. Fife confirmed \$100,000 per year is needed for the current Public Works Trust Fund Ioan. Public Works will wait until the Ioan payment is made to see how much money is available. If we have extra in the fund, it will be used to make sure Franklin County Public Works paves the 30 miles promised first. Any balance remaining then would be programmed annually to pave additional gravel roads.

2008 County Road Budget

Mr. Fife gave the Board a copy of the proposed 2008 County Road Budget. The Board reviewed the information provided.

2008 Annual Construction Program

Mr. Fife submitted the 2008 Annual Construction Program to the Board (Exhibit 2). Mr. Fife changed item number 7 to reflect it will be fully funded with CAP funds. There are not sufficient funds to complete the Dent Road project.

Mr. Fife gave brief descriptions of projects:

- Road 100 Extension Funding is in place except the last \$200,000 +/-. The State is doing an appraisal right now on Road 100. Once the appraisal is completed, Mr. Fife will come to the Board for final approval.
- Pasco Kahlotus Highway (PK Highway) The numbers Public Works provided to do the work are three to five years old. The project may need to be scaled back.
- Safety Improvements Audible advance warning strips have been installed. They
 are very visible at night. The next step is to go to bid on flashing lights on stop
 signs. Then all electrical will be in place for lighting in the future.
- East Foster Wells Road Right-of-way issues are in negotiation.

Juniper Dunes and R170 Landslide flyover

Mr. Koch suggested the media be contacted when the fly-over of Juniper Dunes and R170 Landslide is performed on December 6, 2007.

TRAC MANAGER

TRAC Manager Troy Woody met with the Board.

Environmental Controls System

The Bid Opening for the Environmental Controls System was continued to December 5, 2007, at 10:30 am. All vendors who attended the mandatory walk-through were contacted. The new system will eliminate the current time-consuming and cumbersome system.

October Profit & Loss

The October Profit and Loss Board budget information was reviewed.

Advisory Board Update

Mr. Woody gave the Board an update on the recent TRAC Advisory Board meeting. At the meeting, Pasco City Manager Gary Crutchfield suggested looking at private insurance for liability and property. TRAC paid \$50,000 for liability and property

insurance and \$15,000 for liquor liability insurance in 2007. Ms. Corkrum will contact the Risk Pool to see if TRAC has to be included in the County's policy. Mr. Woody will research insurance through private companies.

Profit Summary 2008

The Board reviewed the projected Profit Summary for 2008 that Mr. Woody gave them. The report does not include subsidies or debt service. TRAC will need a total of \$359,806 for operations subsidies, of which Franklin County's portion is \$179,903. Franklin County will also pay \$44,092 for debt service.

Ms. Corkrum asked if we could transfer revenue from the RV Park to TRAC. Mr. Bowen stated that when we started paying the full-time RV Park manager from the budget, it cut into revenues. We have not been able to transfer revenue to TRAC due to paying the manager's salary. Mr. Koch would like to see the revenue made by the RV Park to be used to replace utilities.

Occupancy Report Year-To-Date

TRAC experienced a growth in revenue of 11.5%, in comparison to the 2007 projection of 7.74%, for a total revenue of \$1,900,003. The revenue figures include amounts received for building rental, parking, and food & beverage.

TRAC was booked for 202 days with paying events, not including hockey. Mr. Woody will contact a representative of Cousins Restaurant to discuss an arrangement for signage. Cousins wants a sign off I-82 and TRAC wants a sign on Road 68. 2008 Capital Requests

Mr. Woody is requesting capital improvements for 2008 including: equipment replacements, chairs and tables, and renovation of the front entrance, atrium floor and conference rooms.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

County Administrator Fred Bowen met with the Board.

<u>Motion</u> – Mr. Miller: I move for approval of the Resolution of the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Washington, adopting a Policy Protecting Individuals

<u>Motion</u> – Mrs. Corkrum: I move for approval of the Resolution for the Guideform Residential Anti-Displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan under Section 104(D) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, As Amended – for the Clark Addition Water Association Project. Second by Mr. Miller. 3:0 vote in favor. This is Resolution Number 2007-610.

Executive Session at 10:53 a.m. regarding an employee evaluation and to evaluate the qualifications of candidate for appointment to elective office based on RCW 42.30.110(1)(g) and RCW 42.30.110(1)(h) and union negotiations based on RCW 42.30.140(4), expected to last up to 45 minutes.
