Commissioners' Proceedings for September 1, 2010

The Honorable Board of Franklin County Commissioners met on the above date. Present for the meeting were Brad Peck, Chairman; Rick Miller, Chair Pro Tem; and Bob Koch, Member; Fred Bowen, County Administrator; and Mary Withers, Clerk to the Board. Meeting convened at 9:00 am.

FRANKLIN COUNTY DISTRICTING COMMITTEE

Public Hearing: Adoption of Franklin County District Court Districting Plan pursuant to RCW 3.38

Public Hearing convened at 9:00 am. Present: Commissioners Peck, Miller and Koch; County Administrator Fred Bowen; and Clerk to the Board Mary Withers. Present in audience: Prosecutor Steve Lowe, Prosecutor's Administrative Assistant Kelly Schadler, Les Storm, District Court Administrator Kelly Martin, Connell Administrator Steve Taylor, Office of Public Defense Coordinator Eric Hsu, City of Mesa Mayor David Ferguson, District Court Judge Jerry Roach and Tri-City Herald Reporter Kristi Pihl.

Prosecutor Steve Lowe explained the process involved in adopting a District Court districting plan. The recommendation of the Districting Committee was to create a department rather than a separate geographical district.

Mr. Peck said the adoption of the committee's recommendation that the District Court have departments, one specifically for Connell and one for the balance of the work of the District Court, is something that we can do and then take no further action. That action in and of itself does not require a second action to then agree to take on the work of City of Connell or any other municipality. It creates a framework to do that but does not require that. It is an important distinction that those are separate and distinct acts. Mr. Lowe said that is correct.

Mr. Peck asked if anyone in the audience would like to comment on the record on the subject of the districting plan that's been recommended by the District Committee.

David Ferguson, mayor of Mesa, asked how will this affect the City of Mesa? We had an agreement with the judge and the City of Connell that they would do our cases and we have a contract with the county that takes the criminal cases. Mr. Peck said his understanding is that the districting plan does not change any of your current practice. It does not require you to make any change. It simply is a framework that allows the county and communities to make changes after

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this action if all the parties agree to do that. In and of itself, this districting agreement does not require any change to what you're doing now. Mr. Peck asked if anyone in the audience knows differently to please share it. There was no response. He asked Mr. Ferguson if that answered his question. Mr. Ferguson said yes. Mr. Peck said there are other questions to be addressed.

Mr. Peck asked three times if anyone else would like to speak for or against, pro or con. There was no response. The public portion of the public hearing was closed.

Mr. Koch said he has no further questions. He thinks it is pretty straightforward.

In response to Mr. Miller's request for clarification, Mr. Lowe said the whole district is the county. It's affecting a municipal department if you want to conceptualize it that way. It is simply creating a framework within the court system to segregate those cases coming within the city municipal code within the city limits of Connell. It doesn't mean that cases couldn't have been heard before but they would have been heard on county paper. He gave an example.

Mr. Lowe explained briefly the procedures involved in doing the work for the City of Connell.

Mr. Lowe said he thinks most of the City of Mesa cases involve code enforcement issues. He said if the City of Mesa is contracting with the City of Connell to do the work, if it's normally done within the Municipal Court, then we would do the work. We don't object to that. We would do that work on behalf of the City of Mesa through the City of Connell. He said there shouldn't be a change. He said he understands there are probably less than three cases a year. Mr. Ferguson said last year there were three cases; this year it might be 10. Mr. Lowe said it has not been a big impact to the City of Connell.

The Board members asked questions and received answers from those in attendance.

Motion – Mr. Koch: Mr. Chairman, I would move for adoption of Franklin County District

Court Districting Plan pursuant to RCW 3.38 and allow the chairman to sign the documents.

Second by Mr. Miller. 3:0 vote in favor. This is Resolution 2010-246.

<u>Motion</u> – Mr. Koch: Mr. Chairman, I move for approval of County Road Fund for \$181,214.23; and MV & PW Equipment Fund for \$99,846.21; for a total amount of \$281,060.44. Second by Mr. Miller. 3:0 vote in favor. (Exhibit 1)

Request for Fairway Road closure CRP 596 R170 Landslide Area, Phase III

Selland Construction, the contractor doing the road construction, has requested a road closure to through traffic from September 7 through November 22. They would provide all the signs and barricades to do it. Mr. Fife recommended approval of the road closure.

Mr. Koch said he talked to Scott English, a property owner in the area of the road closure, who told him his questions had been answered. Mr. Miller had no questions. Mr. Fife answered Mr. Peck's question about the timing of the irrigation work.

The Board gave consensus approval of the road closure.

Enhancement Projects: Benton-Franklin Council of Governments (BFCoG)

BFCoG made a call for transportation enhancement projects due September 3, followed by review by a selection committee which includes a Franklin County representative. The Board asked Mr. Fife to serve on the selection committee.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR

County Administrator Fred Bowen met with the Board.

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Out-of-County Travel

HR Director Rosie H. Rumsey has asked for approval to have her assistant Lisa Schumacher attend a conference in Seattle. There are funds available in the staff travel budget. The commissioners had no objection.

Inter Budget Transfer of \$100,000

Mr. Bowen asked for approval of transfer from Current Expense Non-Departmental Budget to Professional Services for Public Defense, miscellaneous professional services line item, for ongoing costs. This is a portion of the total amount expected to be needed of \$350,000.

Motion – Mr. Miller: Mr. Chairman, I move that we propose the inter budget transfer of \$100,000 from Budget 700, Contingency Reserve line item, to the Public Defense Budget 180, Miscellaneous Professional Services line item. Second by Mr. Koch. For clarification, the motion was to approve the resolution as presented. Mr. Hsu and Mr. Bowen answered the Board's questions. 3:0 vote in favor. This is Resolution 2010-252.

AUDITOR

Auditor Zona Lenhart met with the Board. Ballot Drop Box Placement

The Board had previously given approval for placement of a ballot drop box. They authorized Ms. Lenhart, Mr. Bowen and Mr. Giles to determine the location.

- Mr. Miller is satisfied with what he has seen and heard from the departments.
- Mr. Koch's question was answered regarding why there are three different interlocal agreements with three different termination dates.
- Mr. Peck's questions were answered, including questions about termination of one contract and not the others, the difficulty of starting in the middle of a year, and bench warrants. Mr. Taylor said he can provide the City of Connell's financial analysis information.
- Mr. Taylor said in addition to financial benefits, we believe we're going to see better justice. Additional programs will be available.

District Court Judge Jerry Roach gave information about arrests and transporting to jail.

- Mr. Taylor said the Connell City Council voted unanimously to approve the agreements. Connell received public comment from three individuals. Mr. Koch asked to see the public comments before making a decision. Mr. Taylor will provide the information.
- Mr. Taylor asked for approval of the agreements and explained the reasons for the urgency.
- Mr. Koch would like to review the pros and cons that the City of Connell received. He said the people in the City of Connell are also residents of Franklin County. He would like to wait a week before making a decision.
 - Mr. Peck proposed taking it under advisement for about 90 days to do additional study.
- Mr. Miller said we're going to get this information back and we will pursue it next week. **Consensus Agreement**: Mr. Peck asked do I have consensus from the entire board that by close of business today we'll provide a list to Mr. Bowen of the information that we would like to see that we feel is necessary to render a decision and that he can convey that to the City of Connell and Mr. Lowe and if they can provide that information to us no later than the end of this work week, then we'll be prepared to take this issue up again next Wednesday? Mr. Koch and Mr. Miller agreed.

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Mr. Bowen asked do you want to schedule a formal board meeting again or put it on the consent agenda? Mr. Peck said he feels it needs to be a meeting topic rather than consent agenda.
