Commissioners' Proceedings for September 12, 2012

This document is a summarized version of the Board of Commissioners proceedings. The minutes are paraphrased, not verbatim. Access to an electronic audio recording of the meeting is available upon request.

The Honorable Board of Franklin County Commissioners met on the above date. Present for the meeting were Brad Peck, Chairman; Rick Miller, Chair Pro Tem; and Robert E. Koch, Member; Fred Bowen, County Administrator; and Mary Withers, Clerk to the Board. Meeting convened at 9:00 am.

## HANFORD ADVISORY BOARD (HAB)

Gary Garnant, pending member of the Hanford Advisory Board representing Franklin and Grant Counties, met with the Board. Present in audience: Jim Follansbee, Rich Lahtinen, Patrick Conrad, Roger Lenk, Al Yenney and Tri-City Herald Reporter John Trumbo.

Mr. Garnant has been attending the HAB meetings pending his expected appointment by the Department of Energy (DOE) and gave an update. The Board members responded to his request about Franklin County's particular interests. Mr. Garnant said the county may wish to write a letter to the governor and attorney general urging DOE to take reasonable steps to meet the Federal court requirements for cleanup at Hanford.

#### **OFFICE BUSINESS**

Administrative Assistant Margo Hines met with the Board. Present in audience: Jim Follansbee, Rich Lahtinen, Patrick Conrad, Roger Lenk, Al Yenney and John Trumbo.

Public Comment

Patrick Conrad from the Tri-City Regional Chamber of Commerce invited the Commissioners to a press conference for the Coalition for Power on Thursday, September 27.

Roger Lenk expressed his appreciation to the Board for their concern with taxpayer funds by purchasing a 10-year-old vehicle as a replacement.

Mr. Bowen asked for approval to pay Toni Fulton \$27 per hour for up to 10 hours to assist in some training and office work. The Board members gave approval.

## **TRAC**

The Board discussed the 30-year TRAC operations agreement (set to expire in 2024) and the 20-year bond repayment agreement between Franklin County and the City of Pasco (set to expire in 2014). A city official has indicated to Mr. Bowen the 30-year agreement will be reviewed by the city's legal counsel but that the city official now expects the 30-year agreement will continue to last until 2024 rather than having the city end the agreement in 2014 when the 20-year agreement for bond payments is complete.

(Clerk's reference note:

- Resolution 94-126, Interlocal Agreement and Financing Lease for Trade,
   Recreational and Agriculture Center between Franklin County and the City of
   Pasco became effective May 25, 1994, for a duration of 30 years.
- Resolution 94-121, Ground Lease for Trade, Recreational and Agriculture Center between Franklin County and the City of Pasco for 31 acres, signed May 25, 1994, duration 20 years.)

Mr. Peck summarized the sequence of events: The City of Pasco indicated to the county their intention at the end of the 20-year bond repayment period in approximately 2014 to complete their 30-year agreement with the county that obligates them to pay half of the annual losses. The Board of Commissioners, operating in good faith with that understanding, was looking at other options for the future of TRAC, ideally ones that would allow us to retain TRAC and maybe augment it. Then the Public Facilities District (PFD) made a proposal to either add a water park or convert TRAC to a water park. That was to be sorted out in negotiations. What has transpired most recently is that in additional reviews of the agreement, city officials and the county have recognized for the contract to conclude in 2014 would require mutual approval through a joint resolution signed by the city and the county.

Mr. Peck made the following statement: "I just want to add that there's been an awful lot of discussion about TRAC and there are people on every side of this issue. I want to make clear that the interest that I've expressed and I think the Board has expressed at one time or another in finding options for TRAC was based on the fact that we anticipated the county being saddled with the full cost going forward. When 60,000 of the 80,000 people in the county are in the city,

we felt it appropriate for the city to be sharing that burden. Now that it appears that it's likely that that's how it will come out, I think the energy behind trying to find a new role, a new design for TRAC, is probably behind us.

"I know that there's interest in the Board's part and I share that interest in looking for ways to make TRAC more affordable without jacking up the rates and fees on citizens. We've had discussions over the last few years about how we could make improvements to the arena, whether it's a solid floor deep enough below the dirt that it doesn't impact equestrian use and those kinds of options, and ideally we'd be able to afford to keep TRAC in its current state and perhaps augment and improve it. I think this new news that this agreement probably goes out an additional 10 years might very well be exactly what we need to make that happen.

"So that's my effort at least to try and communicate clearly on behalf of the Board where we think TRAC is today and there's currently no effort to go out and make any significant changes to its future. Is that a fair assessment?"

Mr. Miller asked you said there's no effort to make significant changes at this point?

Mr. Peck said "Immediately. We don't have anything on the table. We're certainly looking at ways that we might be able to enhance it and make it more cost-effective in the future, but we don't have anything specific pending right now. But we're looking at what those options might be."

Mr. Miller agreed. He noted that he has asked for insights from the TRAC Advisory Committee and expects a report will come from the committee. He feels we need to look at every opportunity we have now to maybe expand the use of what we have out there to benefit the people in Franklin County.

Mr. Peck said he thinks the primary function of the TRAC Advisory Board is to advise and make recommendations on how to improve TRAC.

<u>Motion</u> – Mr. Miller: Mr. Chairman, I move that we adjourn at 10:06. Second by Mr. Koch. 3:0 vote in favor.
