Commissioners' Proceedings for December 12, 2012

The Honorable Board of Franklin County Commissioners met on the above date. Present for the meeting were Brad Peck, Chairman; and Robert E. Koch, Member; Fred Bowen, County Administrator; and Mary Withers, Clerk to the Board. Meeting convened at 9:00 am. Commissioner Rick Miller, Chair Pro Tem, was absent due to a family emergency.

### PUBLIC WORKS

Engineer Matt Rasmussen met with the Board. 2013 Annual Construction and Major Equipment Purchases

Mr. Rasmussen reviewed items on the document and answered the Board's questions.

Motion – Mr. Koch: I would move for approval in the matter of the 2013 Annual Construction and Major Equipment Purchases. Second by Mr. Peck. 2:0 vote in favor. Resolution 2012-407 was approved.

Public Hearing convened at 9:06 am. Present: Commissioners Peck and Koch; County Administrator Fred Bowen; Auditor Matt Beaton, Director of Finance Thomas Westerman; and Clerk to the Board Mary Withers. Present in audience: Jim Follansbee, Yesenia Torres, Libbie Wright, Anna Moffatt, Robin Stanco, Craig Matheson, Pat Austin, Jeff Burckhard, Rosie Rumsey, Sherel Webb, Becky Mulkey, Robin Stanco, Julie Jordan, Ashley Heyen, Cameron Mitchell, Yanni Chowriamah, a court bailiff and Tri-City Herald Reporter Michelle Dupler.

Mr. Peck said the Prosecutor has requested that \$24,000 be placed in the Prosecutor's budget under Professional Services for District Court services.

Mr. Peck formally reopened the public hearing for adoption of the 2013 budget at 9:11 am. He asked if anyone in the audience would like to speak.

Yesenia Torres spoke as both the union president and as a taxpayer. Her concerns included: no communication with the union about layoffs and/or furloughs because of Print Shop closure; asking if a cost analysis was done to determine the cost for an outside agency to do county print jobs; concern that departments may have to ask for more money during 2013 for printing costs; addition of employees in the Current Expense budget; and substantial pay increases for some employees. She said she will no longer be able to tell union members there is no money for cost of living adjustment (COLA) increases. Mr. Koch and Mr. Peck responded.

Libbie Wright said she had not planned to "move on" from her job as a newspaper article stated. Mr. Peck summarized a Board conversation from the 2010 budget preparations in which he was told Ms. Wright desired 2-3 more years to reach retirement and it is now 3-plus years later. Ms. Wright feels she is being laid off. She said Franklin County departments are not charged any markup for paper costs through the Print Shop. Mr. Bowen clarified that there is a 21% markup on products provided to the TRAC and Public Works. Ms. Wright said she feels the notification about her job ending could have been handled in a much different way without having to find out in the newspaper. Mr. Peck and Mr. Bowen responded that Mr. Bowen attempted to meet with Ms. Wright around the noon hour shortly after the Board meeting ended but she had gone home for the day. Mr. Bowen reported he also tried to call her at home.

Sherel Webb with Franklin County Historical Society thanked the county for the support they have given to the society including monthly newsletter and quarterly publications printing done by the Print Shop. She said the Society did not have an opportunity to know about the Print Shop closure in time to address it in the Society's 2013 budget. Mr. Peck responded. Mr. Peck asked Mr. Bowen to meet with the deputy prosecutor to determine if providing free printing materials and services to the Franklin County Historical Society constituted a "gifting of public funds."

Mr. Peck asked three times if anyone else wished to comment on the 2013 budget. Auditor Matt Beaton said the budget includes both the Current Expense and Miscellaneous budgets. Hearing was closed to public comment.

The Board decided to approve the Prosecutor's request for \$24,000 to be placed in the Prosecutor's Budget for professional services provided in District Court.

<u>Motion</u> – Mr. Koch: I would move for approval of the 2013 Current Expense Budget which will be Resolution #2012-408 and the 2013 Miscellaneous Budgets which will be Resolution #2012-409. Second by Mr. Peck. 2:0 vote in favor.

Franklin County enthusiastically supports the Port of Pasco's effort to obtain a loan through the Hanford Area Economic Investment Fund Loan Program to purchase land for a future runway extension at the regional Tri-Cities Airport. The runway extension will be needed for large jet aircraft that will begin flying into the Tri-Cities as our population and air travel grows.

Over the past five years, passenger boardings at the Tri-Cities Airport have increased nearly 50 percent, to 330,000 passengers annually. This number is expected to more than double over the next 20 years. We support the Port's efforts to expand our regional airport to meet this growing demand, both on the airfield for larger jet aircraft, and at the terminal for more passengers.

Many smaller commercial airports surrounding our region are losing commercial air service as airlines move to larger planes and to facilities that can support them. By planning for a future runway extension, along with terminal expansion, the Tri- Cities can take advantage of that trend and further establish our region as the air service hub of the greater Mid-Columbia region. Expanding airport facilities will ensure that new flights, and the businesses that come with them, will land in the Tri-Cities.
