The Honorable Board of Franklin County Commissioners met on the above date. Present for the meeting were Rick Miller, Chairman; Robert E. Koch, Chair Pro Tem; and Brad Peck, Member; Fred Bowen, County Administrator; and Mary Withers, Clerk to the Board. Meeting convened at 9:02 am with the Pledge of Allegiance.

JUVENILE JUSTICE CENTER (JJC)

Darryl Banks, JJC Interim Administrator, met with the Board. Present in audience: Lester Storms, Ed Thornbrugh and <u>Tri-City Herald</u> Reporter Geoff Folsom.

<u>Termination of Personal Services Contract between Benton and Franklin Counties Juvenile</u>

<u>Justice Center and DeBord Polygraph Services</u>

Mr. Banks explained that the contractor decided not to purchase required insurance because the cost was too great for the amount of the contract compensation.

County Road Administration Board (CRAB)

Franklin County through disbursement of excess funds will receive an additional approximately \$170,000 to supplement its current County Rural Arterial Program (CAP). CAP funds can be used for maintenance and upkeep but not for new road construction. There was brief discussion about funding and preservation of roads.

Juniper Dunes road project

The project for a road to Juniper Dunes was selected by the Federal government but it is unknown if funding was appropriated at this time. There is no guarantee of funding at this time. Public Works Trust Fund (PWTF)

The PWTF from the current state budget is not fully funded. For Franklin County, there is not a specific effect at this time but there will be an impact because there is not funding available for emergencies such as some bridge programs and some emergency relief programs.
