Fiscal Sustainability Initiative

The initiative has two components: cost containment and revenue generation. There was discussion about some items of concern including expense of complying with public records law, binding interest arbitration, tax authorization, tort law, unfunded mandates from the state, selection of Legislative Steering Committee members, law enforcement costs, and having the state pay for all defense costs in criminal trials.
