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### TRAC and RV Park discussion

Mr. Beaton reviewed his recommendations for the TRAC Center.

Mr. Beaton is not objecting to the total cost of vouchers submitted by TRAC for payment to the RV Park that have been discussed in previous meetings. He explained his concerns about the accounting process for the vouchers.

Mr. Beaton said the operation of ATMs at TRAC has been changed.

Following extensive discussion, the Board asked the County Administrator to work with the TRAC staff and the Auditor's Office to improve the fidelity of the accounting in the two functions of the TRAC Center and the RV Park and to make appropriate adjustments and come back to the Board if there are things that are unclear as to what ought to be done. Mr. Peck noted that no one is alleging that there is any inappropriate conduct or losses or anything of that nature, simply that the processes could stand improvement.

Mr. Beaton said his office has prepared a draft RFP for an independent audit review of TRAC. He will work with the County Administrator and TRAC staff to prepare it in final form.

Mr. Beaton asked the Board from a management standpoint to empower the TRAC Advisory Board and explained further.

There was discussion about whether the budgetary control of RV Park and TRAC should be separate. Mr. Koch wants to see what the internal audit shows before making any big movements. There was discussion about what the audit might include.


