Commissioners' Proceedings for June 4, 2014

This document is a summarized version of the Board of Commissioners proceedings. The minutes are paraphrased, not verbatim. Access to an electronic audio recording of the meeting is available upon request.

The Honorable Board of Franklin County Commissioners met on the above date. Present for the meeting were Robert E. Koch, Chairman; Brad Peck, Chair Pro Tem; and Rick Miller, Member; Fred Bowen, County Administrator; and Mary Withers, Clerk to the Board. Meeting convened at 9:00 am with the Pledge of Allegiance.

AUDITOR

Auditor Matt Beaton and Robin Stanco met with the Board. Present in audience: John Talbott, TRAC Advisory Board Chair Dave Beach, Pasco City Manager Gary Crutchfield, Tim Anderson, Jeff Burckhard, Tom Westerman, Shawn Sant, Matt Mahoney, Matthew Rasmussen, Matt McCormick, Colleen French, Troy Woody and <u>Tri-City Herald</u> Reporter Geoff Folsom.

TRAC RFP

Mr. Beaton asked for approval to issue an RFP for TRAC auditing services.

There was extensive discussion that included the following:

Mr. Miller asked questions about the need for the audit and mentioned it may be expensive. Mr. Beaton said he has been told the cost for an audit could easily exceed \$50,000. The county would not commit to pay for an audit until after the RFPs are received and reviewed.

Mr. Koch questioned the Auditor's urgency to do an RFP now because the state auditor asked for the work to be done three years ago. He questioned why the auditor's office has not shared time with TRAC management to work on it. Mr. Beaton said we developed a series of controls for TRAC to put in place. Mr. Koch asked if Mr. Beaton has considered having a CPA from the City of Pasco and one from the Auditor's Office work together to go through a preliminary audit. Mr. Beaton said we concluded we did not have enough staff or manpower available to do it because of the size and scope of the financial software installation project that is occurring.

Mr. Peck feels the RFP should be issued because county staff may be too close to the situation. He feels others might suggest looking at things the county had not thought about. He

does not feel it has to be done within 30 days. He sees value in having external eyes look at it. Mr. Miller said, "I totally agree. It's not going to cost us anything. It's going to take 30 days."

Mr. Peck and Mr. Miller gave consensus approval to give the auditor the go ahead to issue the RFP.

Pasco City Manager Gary Crutchfield asked that before an RFP is done, one qualified staff member from the county and one from the city meet together to do an initial analysis to determine the scope of work and provide a written report. After that, the cost can be determined. The city can donate and commit 40 man-hours of CPA time. He asked that the county do the same. He reminded the Board that TRAC is a joint effort and the cost of the operation is shared between the county and the City of Pasco. He is concerned about the probability of spending a lot of money unnecessarily. Mr. Peck and Mr. Beaton both responded. Mr. Peck wants to use an objective third party.

John Talbott said he applauds the consensus to pursue issuing an RFP. He also read from a proposal titled "Performance Audits of Franklin County Offices" dated June 4, 2014. He is opposed to subsidizing TRAC to compete with private enterprise.

HANFORD (9:33 am)

Matt McCormick, Manager, Department of Energy, Richland Operations, and Colleen French met with the Board. Present in audience: Matt Mahoney, Matthew Rasmussen, John Talbott, Troy Woody, Geoff Folsom and KONA Reporter Dennis Shannon.

Using slides, Mr. McCormick gave an update about Hanford cleanup and the future of the Hanford site.

Installation of concrete irrigation culverts on Langford Road at intersections with Russell and Sheffield Roads

Installation of flashing lights, signs and other delineating tools such as paint markings
