The Honorable Board of Franklin County Commissioners met on the above date. Present for the meeting were Robert E. Koch, Chairman (by speaker phone); Brad Peck, Chair Pro Tem; and Rick Miller, Member; Fred Bowen, County Administrator; and Mary Withers, Clerk to the Board. Meeting convened at 9:00 am with the Pledge of Allegiance. Chair Pro Tem Brad Peck conducted the meeting.

WASHINGTON COUNTIES RISK POOL (WCRP)

WCRP Executive Director Vyrle Hill and Director of Administrative Services David Goldsmith met with the Board. Present in audience: Paige and Robin Stanco, Tim Dickerson, Tracy Diaz, Bill Middleton, Margo Hines, Matt Mahoney, Matthew Rasmussen and another man.

Mr. Hill and Mr. Goldsmith gave the WCRP Annual Report, using a Power Point presentation on the screen and answering the Board's questions.

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney and Engineer Matthew Rasmussen met with the Board.

<u>Public Hearing: Adoption of 2015-2020 Transportation Improvement Program</u>

Public Hearing convened at 9:47 am. Present: Commissioners Koch (by speaker phone), Peck and Miller; County Administrator Fred Bowen; Public Works Director Matt Mahoney; Engineer Matthew Rasmussen; and Clerk to the Board Mary Withers. Present in audience: Margo Hines, Tim Dickerson, Bill Middleton, Paige Stanco, Tracy Diaz and one other man.

Mr. Peck opened the hearing to public comment at 9:53 am.

Bill Middleton commented, both personally and as a representative of the Good Roads Committee of the Franklin County Farm Bureau. He asked that the county include improvement

of feeder roads and farm-to-market roads in its plan for the areas east of Pasco in the southern end of the county. He said Martindale Road has been paved. Peterson Road is still a private road with landowners providing and hauling dirt and gravel. He said when a public hearing was held before the Commissioners a few weeks ago regarding a petition for an access road to Beus feedlot, the City of Pasco was not represented, and said the City of Pasco uses a lot of land for its re-use water facility in the area but there are not access roads to it. He said we've been paying taxes just like any other resident. He mentioned the Juniper Dunes area, saying it serves quite a community with a lot of recreational use. He said we took our turn and waited for all the irrigation project block roads to get paid off. Those loans are done. He said Ken Piekarski was promised a road in the late 1970s that has never been built.

Mr. Peck talked about the efforts being made to access the Juniper Dunes area. He suggested Mr. Middleton talk to the Public Works Department. Mr. Middleton said he has done that repeatedly over many years. Mr. Mahoney and Mr. Rasmussen stated they did not receive input from the City of Pasco.

Mr. Peck asked if anyone else would like to comment. An unidentified man expressed concerns about proposed freeway on- and off-ramps at Road 52 and Road 44. He was told that they are part of the state highway plans going into city property.

Hearing was closed to public comment.

Commissioners,

The voucher form dated 6/25/2014 raised several concerns in the audit process. There is a voucher charging the entire annual budget for management of the park when only half of the year has passed. While there is clearly a need for cash flow in the "slow" season we do not recommend this method. Our research suggests that to prepay services can be interpreted by the SAO as a loan and that as one fund cannot benefit another is should not be done.

Through my research another condition came to light. The \$100,000 beginning fund balance that Franklin County has provided to TRAC is considered "advanced funds" and falls under section 8.4 of the Interlocal Cooperation Agreement, see attached page. The recommendation is that an analysis of the TRAC's cash flow needs be prepared and presented to the board. At such time the amount should be equally funded by County and the City or the "advanced funds" should be paid interest per the Interlocal.

As I have stated in the past, to have proper transparency, accountability, integrity and efficiency it is recommended that the Franklin RV Park budgetary development and control be assigned to a manager that does not have a vendor relationship with the RV Park.

I will be attaching these comments to the Voucher Form dated 6/25/2014. My signature below is for the approval of all of the vouchers excluding #100222 TRAC Operations Fund.

The County shall undertake all modifications and additions to the TRAC Facility necessary to comply with Government Regulations.

Section 8.4. Payment of Operating Costs.

The Parties covenant they will each pay 50% of any Operating Costs that exceed Revenues from operation of the TRAC Facility in any calendar year. If any Party advances funds for the other Party, such funds shall bear interest at the rate paid by the State of Washington local government investment pool. Each Party reserves the right to determine the source of such payment.

Section 8.5. Emergency Expenditures.

The County or its manager may undertake emergency expenditures without review of the Advisory Board where such expenditures are necessary to meet operating commitments and are required prior to the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Advisory Board.
