SUPERIOR COURT

Superior Court Judge Bruce Spanner, Superior Court Administrator Pat Austin and County Clerk Mike Killian met with the Board. SC-CMS DMS

Ms. Austin, Judge Spanner and Mr. Killian asked for approval of using a new case management system provided by the State of Washington and answered the Board's questions.

Motion – Mr. Miller: Mr. Chairman, I move that we approve the SC-CMS DMS project, option of intent between Franklin County, the Franklin County Clerk, the Superior Court, and the State of Washington Administrative Office of the Courts. Second by Mr. Peck. 3:0 vote in favor. Resolution 2014-351 was approved.

<u>Award of CRP 607 – Birch Bridge #922-4.15 replacement to Big R Bridge</u>

Your firm, Big R Bridge, has been selected to design, supply, fabricate, and deliver a galvanized steel deep corrugated structural plate, full corrugated metal invert and associated design work for foundation and cast in place concrete headwalls as described in the Request for Proposal submitted on July 3rd, 2014 for the CRP 607 – Birch Bridge #922-4.15 Replacement.

Big R Bridge will submit shop drawings for approval within 4 weeks of this award letter. 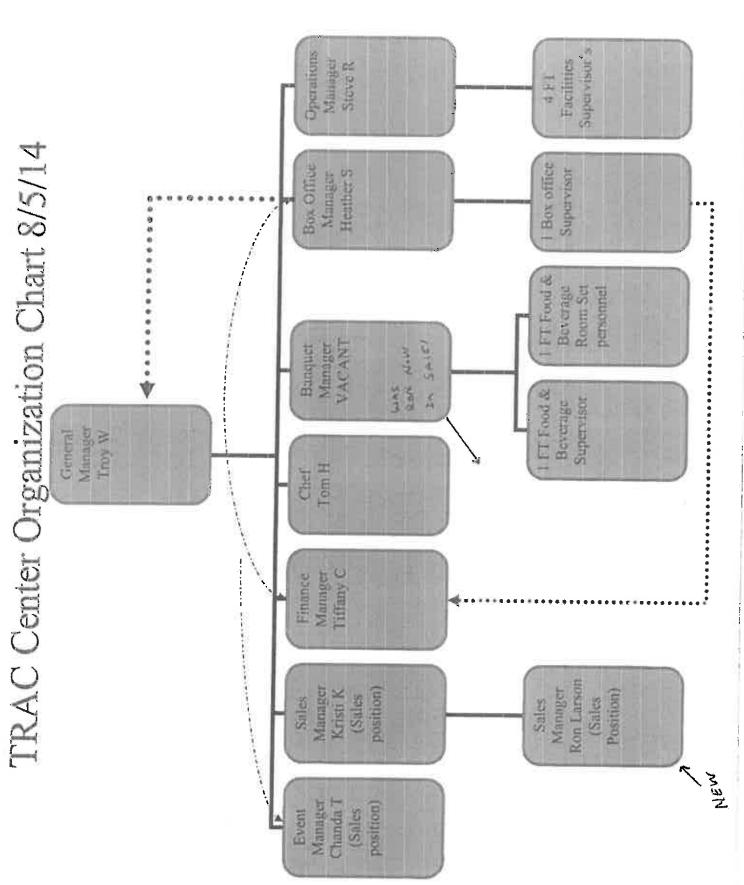
