Recommendation for executive recruiting firm regarding County Administrator position

Interim County Administrator Jerrod MacPherson reported to the Board that four proposals were received for recruitment of a new County Administrator. Human Resources Director Carlee Nave recommended the recruiting firm Prothman.

The Board agreed by general consent to place a contract with Prothman on the May 13th Consent Agenda for approval.

Commissioner Miller asked if it was worthwhile hiring an interim manager for TRAC. Chairman Peck recused himself from the discussion because he's worked with an applicant in other capacities.

The Board won't take any action until at least the meeting of May 27th to allow for additional applications for the Manager position.

Crisis Response Unit (CRU) (10:49 am)

The Board discussed House Bill 1145, which allows multiple counties to meet together. The bill was signed by the Governor on April 24, 2015, and becomes effective July 24, 2015.
