# APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2016-101 AWARDING MAGNESIUM CHLORIDE CONTRACT

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney addressed the Board recommending Envirotech Services, Inc., be awarded the 2016 Materials Bid for the application of thirty percent (30%) magnesium chloride solution of various county roads.

# APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2016-102 APPROVING A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT WITH GOOSE INSURANCE ADMINSTRATIVE SYSTEMS (GOOSE IAS)

Director of Finance Tom Westerman and Accounting Supervisor Tim Anderson addressed the Board explaining the Affordable Care Act (ACA) has a reporting provision that began in fiscal year 2015. The County's legacy software (AS400) does not produce the 1095 forms or generate the appropriate Internal Revenue Service electronic file forms for the County to remain

compliant with the ACA. Mr. Westerman explained although the new software (OneSolution) will generate the necessary forms and reporting requirements in the future, it has not yet been implemented.

Conover Insurance recommended contracting with Goose IAS to generate the forms necessary for FY2015. Mr. Westerman stated the fiscal impact for generated the forms was \$7,000 and would be expensed via an intra-budget transfer of \$7,000 from the 2016 Current Expense Non-Departmental budget line item (101700/5000 (Contingency) to budget line item 101700 4100 (Professional Services).

\* Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2016-102 authorizing a professional services contract with Goose IAS to provide FY2015 Affordable Care Act reporting and also approval of an intra-budget transfer of \$7,000 from the 2016 current expense non-departmental budget line item the 2016 Current Expense Non-Departmental budget line item (101700/5000 (Contingency) to budget line item 101700 4100 (Professional services). Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

#### COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR KEITH JOHNSON

Franklin County Economic Development Plan Update: Franklin County Administrator Keith Johnson explained the Franklin County Economic Development Plan had previously been brought before the Board as a draft. Although there was not a deadline for approving the plan, staff felt the sooner the plan was approved, the better.

Commissioner Peck asked if City of Pasco and Port of Pasco had weighed in on the revision to plan. Commissioner Koch also felt the City and the Port should see the plan.

Mr. Johnson stated he would keep the Board informed and bring back for approval when appropriate.

> TRAC Facility Improvements - Concrete Flooring: Mr. Johnson stated he had met with the Home Builders Association Executive Officer Jeff Losey and discussed installing a concrete flooring at TRAC. During that meeting, Mr. Losey stated other venues had installed concrete flooring and continued to host rodeo events.

There was extensive discussion regarding whether dirt flooring or concrete flooring would be most effective for the County, its citizens, users of the facility and TRAC. Mr. Losey spoke in favor of a concrete or sturdy floor while Bobo McMillan spoke against anything but dirt flooring. Several scenarios and alternatives were discussed including portable flooring. The consensus was portable flooring would meet the needs of the users of TRAC.

After hearing both sides, the consensus of the Board was no concrete floor would be installed at this time.
