Commission Chairman, Rick Miller called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Miller led the Pledge of Allegiance.

BUREAU OF RECLAMATION FY 2017 BUDGET REQUEST

Trustee for the Columbia Basin Development League Ms. Michele Kiesz presented a request to sign a letter of support for the irrigation land owners in the Columbia Basin Project area. Ms. Kiesz gave a background history of the Odessa groundwater replacement project and irrigation that the farmers are using at the present time. The landowners are financially unable to fund the final construction of this federal project solely with the sale of the crops grown on those acres. Their goal is to obtain additional funding to complete the project and bring much needed surface water to the area. Irrigation wells are not the only groundwater supplies that are being depleted; there is also a need to sustain the municipalities within our District.

Commissioner Koch moved to amend and approve the document to put in Franklin County resolution format and addressed not just a sub-committee but to anyone who is interested and return to next week's meeting. Commissioner Peck seconded and the motion was carried unanimously.

TRI-CITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SYSTEM REVIEW COMMITTEE REPORT

Greater Columbia Behavioral Health Director Ken Roughton and Benton-Franklin Counties Human Services Director Kyle Sullivan recommended a Consultant that would fine tune the current system aimed at increasing efficiencies and improving general services. Secondly, align the current system with full health care system being integrated by 2020.

Tri-City Behavioral Health Committee had a discussion and came to a consensus to nominate Rick Weaver as the new Consultant. Commissioner Peck agreed that Mr. Weaver is highly qualified. However, Commissioner Peck has a concern that this may be a conflict of interest with Mr. Weaver being a Consultant as well as a possible Provider in the future. Commissioner Peck suggested that Mr. Weaver would enter into a no compete contract unless, no other local providers are capable to do this job, thus avoiding any possible conflict of interest. All agreed that Mr. Weaver would be a highly skilled Consultant.
