

JUNE 1, 2016

CALL TO ORDER

Commission Chairman, Rick Miller called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

Commissioners Present: Commission Chair Rick Miller, Chair Pro Tem Robert E. Koch and Member Brad Peck.

Staff Present: County Administrator Keith Johnson, Human Resources Director Carlee Nave, HR Generalist Danita Wetle, Public Works Director Matt Mahoney, Assistant to the Administrator Sherrie Young and Clerk to the Board Karin Milham.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Miller led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Public Comment:

Commissioner Peck moved to amend the schedule to add Mike Schwisow to comment, so that it will be part of the record. Commissioner Koch seconded the motion and was carried unanimously.

Columbia Basin Development League Update presented by Mike Schwisow

Mr. Schwisow updated the Board on the water projects and improvements within the Odessa Subarea. He submitted a packet with maps and explained what goals and projects were in store for the League in the future.

The Odessa Ground Water Replacement Program is a targeted plan to deliver water to eligible and interested deep well irrigated lands that must be in the Columbia Basin Project and in the Odessa Ground Water Management Subarea (established by the State Department of Ecology), among other eligibility criteria. The purpose is to switch those landowners who are now using deep wells to pull ground water for irrigation from the Odessa aquifer (while they were waiting for Columbia Basin Project expansion) and transfer them to surface water supplies (from CBP). The program has two major construction elements: 1) expand and improve the East Low Canal for added capacity, and 2) build pump stations and pipelines to deliver water to farms. OGWRP entails three different surface water supplies for irrigation water deliveries.
