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\* Commissioner Koch moved to approve the Consent Agenda 1-13 with the removal of #8. Commissioner Peck seconded asking for discussion regarding Consent Agenda Item9. After a brief discussion the motion was carried unanimously.

### ADMINISTRATION OFFICE BUSINESS

- Administrator Keith Johnson stated the County was proceeding with a Bi-County termination letter to Greater Columbia Behavioral Health for Crisis Services. The distinction of when this would happen was clarified, so services would not be dropped and changes could be implemented.
- Steve Reinke will meet with Mr. Johnson and give him an update regarding the 911 consolidation project. Due to the recent law enforcement shootings in Dallas, a meeting with the Sheriff has been postponed. Great progress is being made on the project and key discussions will regard final costs, as well as how the model will look.
- Mr. Johnson stated the previously discussed speeding issues on Wernett Road were being looked into by the Public Works department. After reviewing the area and legal options, Public Works suggested a permanent electronic speed sign be put in place. They have found the signs to be effective and may reduce the problem of speeding in this area.
- The end of Columbia River Road is experiencing littering and target shooting. This has gone past being a nuisance to neighbors and is now considered a public hazard. Commissioner Peck will be looking into what can be done about this problem.
- Emergency Management will be moving out of their current building and relocating to the Armory the end of August. Mr. Johnson was considering relocating WSU Extension and the Planning and Building Department once the building has been vacated by Emergency Management. This would allow easier access to the public for Planning as well as provide further expansion as the community grows.

Commissioners were open to the idea but felt if it did not help the public, save money or was of strategic value, then perhaps we should not move further on this.

That the two counties file jointly as the plaintiff or initiate action and that possibly filing and if any damages are accessed that they be shared jointly Benton and Franklin County 50/50.

\* Commissioner Peck moved to approve the motion that Mr. Dickerson just presented. Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

It was noted that Wendy Culverwell from the Tri-City Herald was called by Mr. Dickerson to inform her of this action that was not anticipated.
