## CALL TO ORDER

Commission Chairman, Rick Miller called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

#### PUBLIC HEARING

Testimony Regarding Vacating a Portion of Right-Of-Way on South Canal Boulevard in Basin City

Commissioner Miller recessed into a Public Hearing at 9:02 a.m., to accept public testimony regarding vacating a portion of right-of-way on south Canal Boulevard in Basin City.

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney addressed the Board regarding RCW 36.87.060. This Public Hearing is for Franklin Country Commissioners to consider the report of the County Engineer together with any evidence for or against such vacation and abandonment.

County Engineer Craig Erdman presented a summary of his report regarding vacation of South Canal Boulevard as requested by the Board of Commissioners during the April 27, 2016 Regular Meeting. Parcel number 121-261-073 is currently in agricultural production. The proposed vacation would not impact the production or access to said parcel. Several easements remain in Basin City Industrial Park No. 1 Plat that can provide access should the parcel be developed in the future. Retention of easement by the County for construction, repair, and maintenance of public utilities would be included as to RCW 36.87.140.

Commissioner Miller asked for Public comment. Having none, Commissioner Miller closed the Public Hearing and reconvened the Regular meeting at 9:13 a.m., and called for a motion.

## APPROVAL TO EXTEND OFFER FOR BUILDING INSPECTOR POSITION

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave addressed the Board on behalf of the Planning and Building Department, who has requested to offer a highly qualified, unidentified candidate entry at Grade 15/Step 2. There would be no impact to the 2016 budget.

All of the Commissioners approved the Grade 15-Step 2 for Building Inspector Position.

# WASHGINTON STATE UNIVERSITY (WSU) NUTRITION AND FOOD SAFETY UPDATE

WSU Food & Nutrition Specialist Lizann Powers-Hammond presented the Board with the latest on impact reports which are as follows:

- The Benton-Franklin Master Food Preservers documented 900 hours of outreach, helping others in the community adopt safe food handling and preservation practices.
- Volunteers documented 5,195 contact using the on-line reporting system
- SNAP-ED The Southeast Cluster Food Sense program provided direct education to 2,471 youth and 436 adults.
- ESBA- Eat Smart Be Active is reaching to all areas of the community to instill basic skills and adult education.

Extension offices across the nation have closed due to various reasons but funding being a prime reason. Because few offices remain, the WSU Extension office has been a great resource to the counties in the state of Washington, as well as nationally. The goal is to continue to build and strengthen the food system in our area. The areas of the food system consist of: Production, Processing, Distribution, Access, Consumption, and Resource/ Waste Recovery.

## WASHINGTON STATE UNIVERSITY (WSU) ANIMAL SCIENCE UPDATE

WSU Livestock Specialist Don Llewellyn, Ph.D., gave a Five-Year Recap for the Franklin County Commissioners.

- Three main focus areas are:
  - o Beef cow nutrition and reproduction
  - o Livestock production, safety, and quality
  - o Management systems focused on reducing production costs

- o Mr. Llewellyn is now serving as Washington State Co-coordinator for the national Beef Quality Assurance (BQA) program, which provides training to feedlot operators and employees as well as cow/calf and dairy producers.
- Recent programs include
  - o Beef cow nutrition and management
    - 260 producers, 40 youth
    - Representing over 25,000 head of cattle
  - o Bovine Respiratory Disease Education
    - 165 participants
    - Representing nearly 16,000 head of cattle
  - o Quality Assurance Training for youth (all species)
    - Over 275 youth per year
  - Steer of Merit and Lamb of Merit
    - Benton Franklin Fair
    - Columbia Basin Junior Livestock Show
  - Low-Stress Cattle Handling
    - Cattle feeding workforce handles about 488,000 head of cattle per year.

Mr. Llewellyn introduced his Assistant, WSU Graduate Eli Walker. Mr. Walker has been researching Winter Canola as a forage, silage and seed source. He has experimented with different rates of nitrogen and sulfur fertilization and the impact it makes on the yield and composition of the Canola. Since Canola has high moisture content, Mr. Walker is experimenting with Alfalfa cubes as a wicking technique to help preserve the silage. He is also researching the feasibility of using Winter Canola as an emergency feed source when regular sources are not available.
