

CALL TO ORDER

Commission Chairman, Rick Miller called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

CONCERNED CITIZENS PRESENTATION

Future of Mental Health Services - Presented by Mr. Claude Oliver

Mr. Claude Oliver addressed the Commission on behalf of a concerned citizens group calling itself "One Stop" and gave a PowerPoint presentation of the 2008 Feasibility Study done for the Benton Franklin Counties Consolidated Crisis Response Center.

Mr. Oliver explained the report was the effort of a team of individuals from the Benton Franklin Community Action Committee, Benton Franklin Department of Human Services, Nueva Esperanza Detox Center, Local businessman and developer, Carl Cadwell, Bill McCue of McCue & Associates/Architects and Ms. Anne Strode of Washington institute for Mental Health Research and Training at WSU-Spokane.

He addressed feasibility of consolidation and facility needs stating clinical staff from CRU/SAAC reported the current building does not serve the programs well and is inconveniently located. Capital improvements are needed, Counties do not charge Nueva Esperanza for the building housing the detox program in Pasco and buildings are too small, not energy efficient and have exceeded their useful life.

There was extensive discussion of the need for improved mental health services in our area and several examples of situations where individuals were in need of those services were discussed.

Mr. Oliver stated Yakima County has a good program and the group was reviewing the details of that operation.

The Commission thanked Mr. Oliver for the presentation.

CREATION OF A TEMPORARY INFORMATION SERVICES OFFICE ASSISTANT POSITION

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave presented a request from the Information Services Director to approve a creation of a temporary Information Services Office Assistant. An employee is on a temporary short work schedule and Information Services is having a back log of work. This position request would be approximately 20 hours a week and continue till the end of the year or until services are no longer required.
