Commission Chairman, Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 10:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

LEGISLATIVE REPRESENTATION OLYMPIA

Mr. Jim Potts and Zac Kennedy reported briefly on a few bills that will be brought forth that pertain to our area. Nine bills currently address water issues. Mr. Potts stated that there are approximately one hundred (100) bills being entered every day. They are reviewing them and will report on the bills that affect our region.

TRI-CITY REGIONAL CHAMBER OF COMMERCE - NEW EDGE "TOP OF THE BOX PROJECT"

Managing Director Aaron Welling presented the Board with a PowerPoint presentation. Mr. Welling explained that the Tri-City Regional Chamber of Commerce formed a Regional Affairs Committee consisting of approximately twelve members. New Edge was hired to help build a roadmap to assist in the process of the area development.

The theme is called "Top of the Box", which relates to a puzzle. To put a puzzle together, one would need to look at the "Top of the Box" or photo to get the whole picture. In the same sense our region and its growth relies on looking at the bigger picture. We need a vision of the future and explore the opportunities available to us, then form a strategy to meet those goals.

There are many pieces to a puzzle and each person young or old is needed to make it a successful endeavor. The official kick off for the Big Vision Workshop will be the end of February and will be approximately two months of research on different ideas. Everyone is invited to participate and get involved with the program to better our Community.
