The roof is in serious need of repair and needs to be taken care of immediately. Mr. Johnson requested to bring a resolution back to the Board next week to address the necessary funding required to move forward with the needed repairs. The Commissioners agreed to have Mr. Johnson submit the documents which would enable the repair of the Juvenile Justice Center roof.

Mr. Johnson explained that the reasoning for meeting at TRAC facility was to assess the facility to see what improvements would be in the best interest for the future of the TRAC. The tour was given by TRAC manager Tom French and he presented the Board with items which need to be addressed at this time as well as in the future.

- Insulation on walls is falling down and needs to be replaced

### Arena

- New temporary floor has been replaced
- Discussion of temporary floor in Arena and future options
- Insulation on walls is falling down and needs to be replaced

#### Outdoor Arena

- Discussion on possibilities of improving outdoor arena area
- Possibility of removing some horse barns to allow for additional space to improve on existing arena
- Potentially cover outdoor arena

#### Pavilion

- Currently used for Ice Hockey and is leased until 2018
- Equipment in facility is old and difficult to replace
- Discuss possibilities for the Pavilion once lease has ended

## Parking lot

- Repair/re-surface parking lot
- Lighting upgrade possible LED energy efficient

The tour of the facilities was completed at 10:30 a.m. and a discussion of possible future prospects resumed.

Administrator Keith Johnson informed the Board that there is a Company that would like to purchase the naming rights of the TRAC. The process of this endeavor has yet to be determined. The Commissioners will review this item of business after more information has been gathered.

Mr. French is looking to outsource catering for the TRAC which would allow for different venues to take part in offering their services.

The TRAC is a great asset to the community. The Commissioners acknowledged the outstanding job Mr. French has done in making improvements to the facilities, as well as managing fiscal challenges.

The TRAC Mission Statement "to provide a clean well maintained facility that enhances our community and to provide world class service to our guest."
