#### CALL TO ORDER

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

#### JUVENILE JUSTICE CENTER FACILITIES PRESENTATION

Benton County Commissioner Jerome Delvin displayed a PowerPoint presentation to the Franklin County Commissioners on the At-Risk Youth Services Center Capital Project. Commissioner Delvin presented the concerns of the Juvenile Justice Center and several options available to address those concerns.

#### Project Background

- 1979: Original Benton-Franklin Counties Juvenile Justice Center is constructed with an Administration/Courtroom Wing and a Detention Wing.
- 1996: New detention facility is constructed and attached to the west end of the existing facility.
- Over time: Original facility develops programmatic and structural issues.
- 2015: Counties engage a project team of architects, engineers, and a juvenile justice consultant who, in collaboration with stakeholders, develop three options to resolve the issues.
- Options 1 and 2: Renovations/additions ranging in cost from \$8.9 \$9.5 million.
- Option 3 (Recommended): Demolition of the 1979 Administration/Courts facility and construction of a new 38,000 square foot facility at a cost of \$9.9 million.
- 2017: Benton County engages Gordon Thomas Honeywell Governmental Affairs (GTH-GA) to research potential external funding sources for a renovated or reconstructed facility.

Commissioner Delvin projected a legislative process of about 2 -3 years. Franklin County Commissioners were in agreement that the facilities were in need of repair. Commissioner Koch suggested that the current building be demolished to enable a new two story facility. Commissioner Peck suggested selling the current building and uses those funds to build in a new area. All Franklin County Commissioners were in support of improving the Juvenile Justice Center.

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney presented the Board with Resolution 2017-171, Declaring County-Owned Property (miscellaneous) as surplus and authorization for disposal of the property via Public Auction. Items listed for disposal are: Aladdin Pressure Washer, 7 Auger Bits, 1 Snap On Drill Press, 1 Lancaster Drill Press, 1 Port a Cool A/C unit, 1 Water Fountain, 1 DTC Line Laser Paint Striper, 1 Central Pneumatic Portable Air Compressor, 1 Bulk Fuel Tank, 1 Pick Up Tool Box, 27 Boxes of Miscellaneous obsolete Car and Truck Parts.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2017-171 Declaring County-Owned Property as surplus and authorization for disposal for the property via Public Auction. Commissioner Miller second and the motion carried.

#### PUBLIC HEARING

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney presented the Board with Resolution 2017-170 Declaring County –Owned Property as surplus and authorization for disposal of the property via public auction.

The Franklin County Public Works Department maintains a fleet of vehicles, through the Motor Vehicle (ER&R) Fund, including a 2007 Ford Escape, a 2007 Chevy Colorado, a 1995 Clark Forklift, a 1995 Radar Trailer, and a 1996 Trail Blazer Belly Dump Trailer.

In accordance with RCW 36.33A.030, the Board of Franklin County Commissioners have appointed the Public Works Director as the administrator of the Motor Vehicle (ER&R) Fund; and the Public Works Director has determined the vehicles, listed above, to have reached the end of their useful life for county purposes, and that the sale of said vehicles, through public auction, to be the most cost effective for the county.

Commissioner Koch recessed into a Public Hearing at 9:30 a.m., to accept public testimony regarding Resolution 2017-170, Declaring County-Owned Property as surplus and authorization for disposal of the property via public auction.

Commissioner Koch asked for Public comment. Having none, Commissioner Koch closed the Public Hearing and reconvened the Regular meeting at 9:33 a.m. and called for a motion.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2017-170 Declaring County –Owned Property as surplus and authorization for disposal of the property via public auction. Commissioner Miller seconded and the motion carried.

Planning and Building Director Loren Wiltse presented SUB 2017-01, subdividing approximately 8.14 acres into 13 Single Residential Lots to the Commissioners.

There was a brief discussion on several items.

- o The width of roads and parking regulations.
- o Irrigation and storm water runoff.
- O Who is responsible for the upkeep of property between landowner boundary and the road?
- \* Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2017-156, preliminary plat SUB 2017-01, subject to the six findings of fact and seven conditions of approval, noting that the paper provided to the Commissioners had six conditions of approval and the Board administratively added a seventh condition; that the lot owner is responsible to maintain said property and right of ways. Commissioner Miller seconded and the motion carried.

Planning and Building Director Loren Wiltse presented SUB 2017-02 to subdivide approximately 39.11 acres into 55 Residential Lots to the Commissioners.

Upon the Boards previous request in a prior meeting, Mr. Wiltse clarified the parking policy on the proposed roads.

\* Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2017-149, preliminary plat SUB 2017-02, subject to the six findings of fact and seven conditions of approval, noting that the paper provided to the Commissioners had six conditions of approval and the Board administratively added a seventh condition; that the lot owner is responsible to maintain said property and right of ways. Commissioner Miller seconded and the motion carried.

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave presented the Board with a proposal to approve hiring of a Deputy Prosecuting Attorney II at Grade 20, Step 6. Ms. Nave explained that the applicant has a considerable amount of qualifications that would be beneficial to the County.

All Commissioners were in agreement to allow Ms. Nave to offer the Deputy Prosecuting Attorney II at Grade 20, Step 6 position to applicant.
