#### CALL TO ORDER

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

#### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

#### **BENTON FRANKLIN TRANSIT**

General Manager Gloria Boyce presented the Board with the latest information on the transit agency in Tri-Cities area. Below is a list of topics reviewed.

- Benton Franklin Transit started in 1983 with 10 vehicles and now has a fleet of 533
- 7<sup>th</sup> largest out of 31 transit agency in the State of Washington
- In 2012 they became a large urban system which allows them to receive direct federal funding
- 90% of riders are transit dependent
- Services available are fixed routes, dial a ride, vanpools and taxi- contracted services
- Improvements were made to the Benton Franklin Fair and Rodeo route
- Working with employers, social services and local agencies to increase vanpool availability
- Increase of service to local schools and youth programs
- New technology to add Wi-Fi
- 2000-2015 Tri-City regions grew by 48% escalating the need to keep up with demands
- Added a new night schedule to accommodate those on night shift

Benton Franklin Transit will continue to verify the most recent data and make changes as needed to accommodate the community to the best of their ability.



#### WSU EXTENSION TREE FRUIT AND VITICULTURE

Tree Fruit and Viticulture Specialist Gwen-Alyn Hoheisel presented the Board with updates in her department.

The Kennewick office has moved and are now located in the same building as the health district. This has been a great move and will help accommodate the community on a higher level due to the educational food programs available.

There was a food garden team which consisted of 54 volunteers who work with low income families. There were 17 different food projects going on in the area with grant money received by United Way. One project can consist of multiple garden beds. There were approximately 316 people who benefited from these raised garden projects. Lowe's is the biggest supporter of these projects as they donate supplies and they mandate that their employees volunteer in building the raised beds for the gardens.

Evaluate, educate and create are the 3 areas in which Ms. Hoheisel is working on as it pertains to sprayer technology. Ms. Hoheisel has been working with the department of Agriculture to educate farm workers on the spraying of crops. These classes were given both in English and Spanish to teach and inform them of techniques that would optimize spray, sprayer drift, operations, calibration, and worker safety.

Ms. Hoheisel attended a sprayer technology conference in Europe with 70 Ag Engineers that deal with sprayers only on a daily basis. There are Spanish and Belgian companies who are currently working with John Deere and Washington Tractor. They will be bringing this technology to Prosser area for testing and evaluation.

The newer apple variety of "Cosmic Crisp" is doing well and they will be planting 3 million more next year. The Red Delicious does not produce much or pay off well. The consumer's of the Golden Delicious has significantly decreased, as well as the Granny's.
