CALL TO ORDER

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

Commissioner Koch led the Pledge of Allegiance

WASHINGTON STATE UNIVERSITY EXTENSION UPDATE

AnaMaria Diaz Martinez presented the Board with updates on the WSU Youth, Family and Community Engagement program. There are 3 areas of engagement.

Health, Wellness, and Active Living Across the Life Span

Youth Advocates for Health: Youth Voice – Youth Choice: Health Rocks! This program teaches youth how to stay healthy and involves families with wholesome activities and education.

Human and Family Development

Strengthening Families Program for Parents and Youth 10-14 (SFP10-14) a nationally and internationally acclaimed prevention program to prevent or delay early onset use of drugs and alcohol.

Community Impact Projects

Policy Impact and Development Research is a partnership with Washington State Department of Health for two major projects: Marijuana Health Education Project and Challenges, Barriers, and Impact of Teen Fathers in the Tri-Cities.

Strategies for Effective Eating Development-SEEDS

Two hundred Franklin County families participated in this program. Curriculum supported parents and pre-school aged children 4-6 years of age with education on feeding styles and the impact of emotional coaching during meal times.

Stress and Coping- SCRP is a curriculum and program for parents with children ages 9-12 years of age, which teaches strategies of coping that help youth move through controllable/uncontrollable situations. One hundred sixty Franklin County families participated in this project.

BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT (BLM) UPDATE

District Manager Linda Clark and Border Field Manager Lindsey Babcock presented the Board with latest update with the Eastern Washington BLM District.

- Coeur d'Alene and Spokane Districts now serve under a single leadership, retaining their identities as two separate units with flexibility to share resources.
- The Resource Management Planning (RMP) revision effort in eastern Washington will provide objectives and direction for the management of approximately 425,000 acres of BLM administered lands.
- Eastern Washington Resource Advisory Council will hold its next meeting October 26th to focus on RMP and Juniper Dunes access road in Franklin County.
- BLM is ready to offer Franklin County 3.2 miles of ROW grant over public land, following the successful negotiations with private landowners.
- Law enforcement agreement is in place with the Franklin County Sheriff's Office to fund patrols at Juniper Dunes during peak use periods.
- Suppression agreements are in place with Franklin County Rural Fire Districts #3 and #5 that border the Juniper Dunes area.

FRANKLIN COUNTY TO BECOME A MID-ADOPTER WITH A TRANSITION YEAR

Benton-Franklin Counties Human Services Director Kyle Sullivan presented the Board with three basic options available to the County in regards to adoption changes in Behavioral Health program.

- Become a Mid-Adopter
- Become a Mid-Adopter with 1 year transition
- No Mid-Adoption

After a brief discussion on the options, the Commissioners brought their decision to a vote.

* Commissioner Miller moved to approve Resolution 2017-286 to execute as a Mid-Adopter with a 1 year transition. Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion carried 2:1. Commissioner Peck opposed.

INTER-BUDGET TRANSFER OF \$77,855.00 TO DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS FOR PAYMENT OF KMB ARCHITECTS INVOICES.

County Administrator Keith Johnson explained to the Board that the transfer of funds was necessary to cover costs that were not included in the budget last year.

* Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2017-287, in the matter of requesting an inter-budget transfer of \$77,855.00 from the 2017 current expense Non-Departmental budget 101-700, line item 5000 Contingency, to the Corrections budget 101-540, Professional Services. Commissioner Miller seconded and the motion carried.

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT- CUP 2017-04 FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF A BREWERY TASTING ROOM

Planning and Building Director Loren Wiltse and AHBL Consultant Nicole Stickney presented the Board with an application of a Conditional Use Permit 2017-04 for the establishment of a brewery tasting room that would be open to the public.

After a brief discussion on proposed roads and establishing parking area requirements, the Commissioners agreed to change phrasing in this document that would require the owner to comply with the County codes.

* Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2017-288, CUP 2017-04 subject to the 6 findings of fact and 9 conditions of approval with the following stipulation, and that is condition of approval 2 e. subparagraph i.i. which reads, the parking lot standards contained in FCC 17-78-090 and 17-078-120 will apply. The subparagraph will end after the word "apply" and strike everything after in that sentence. Commissioner Miller seconded and the motion carried.

PERSONAL SERVICES CONTRACT WITH AHBL INC.

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney presented the Board with a Personal Services contract with AHBL.

* Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2017-289 a Personal Services Contract between Franklin County and AHBL, Inc. providing for the periodic review and update of the County's Comprehensive Plan and Development Regulation, if necessary, to meet requirements of the GMA, RCW 26.70A.130. Commissioner Miller seconded and the motion carried.
