#### **CALL TO ORDER**

Commission Chairman Brad Peck called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

#### PROCLAMATION OF PUBLIC SERVICE RECOGNITION WEEK

The "Public Service Recognition Week" Proclamation was read aloud for the record by Commissioner Koch.

Commissioner Koch moved to approve the Public Service Recognition Week Proclamation May 6-12, 2018 for Franklin County. Commissioner Peck seconded and the motion carried.

#### GREATER COLUMBIA BEHAVIORAL HEALTH UPDATE

Benton Franklin Human Services Director Kyle Sullivan gave the Board an update on the progress of moving forward with the 2020 integration as mid-adopters in 2019 with a year transition.

The State required several steps of action in order to start the process of becoming fully integrated by 2020. Behavioral Health Organization (BHO) received a letter stating the required steps were not completed by the specified time constraints. Therefore, the BHO was not eligible for the transition year and would only qualify as a mid-adopter at the end of 2018.

There are many unanswered questions regarding the process of how the 2020 integration will transpire between the State and the BHO.

#### STEP 7 HIRE OF CORRECTIONS MAINTENANCE TECH

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave explained to the Board that the Corrections department has had a vacant Corrections Maintenance Technician position since 1/22/2017. While we have been actively recruiting and advertising over the course of the past year, it has proven challenging to find a candidate with the appropriate skills and background to fill the position.

The Sheriff has identified a candidate to fill the opening who is currently employed as a Corrections Corporal. The identified candidate has nearly 18 years of experience with Franklin County Corrections, and previous experience in electrical/HVAC repair as well as general carpentry.

Based on the candidate's qualifications and experience, as well as the difficulty in filling the position, the Sheriff is requesting to hire the candidate at Grade 13, Step 7.

Commissioner Koch moved to approve Step 7 hire of an existing County employee for Corrections Maintenance Tech. Commissioner Peck seconded and the motion carried.
