Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Brad Peck called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

Commissioners Present: Commission Chair Brad Peck, Chair Pro Tem Rick Miller and Member Robert Koch

Staff Present: County Administrator Keith Johnson, Chief Prosecuting Attorney Jennifer Johnson, AHBL Personal Services Contractor Nicole Stickney, Human Resources Director Carlee Nave, Human Resources Generalist Eric Wyant, Public Works Director Matt Mahoney, Pest Board Coordinator Tom Wilson, and Clerk of the Board Karin Milham

9:02 AM 2019 Pest Board Budget Resolution 2018-291

Pest Board Coordinator Tom Wilson presented the 2019 Pest Board Budget to the Board for their approval. Mr. Wilson reviewed the numbers with the Commissioners and explained the increase of the Professional Services-Enforcement. He also addressed the probability of acquiring a new truck in the next year or two.

The Pest Board would like to obtain a balance of one hundred thousand dollars in the Professional Services-Enforcement budget line. This would allow for funding during emergencies dealing with pest and diseased trees. There was a discussion on whether the proposed funds were set too high, and what the history behind this proposed amount is.

The Commissioners agreed in sending the 2019 Budget Resolution 2018-291 back to the Pest Board for recommended changes.

- o Reserve line added to the budget instead of being listed under Professional Services Enforcement
- o No further building of the funds and make new assessments

9:38 AM Washington State University Extension 4-H Faculty Vacancy

WSU Extension Assistant and Acting Director Michael Gaffney informed the Board of the newly implemented budget of Washington State University (WSU) and the impact it has had on the WSU Extension Program. WSU has been operating on a thirty million dollar operation deficit and using reserves. To resolve this issue, the new budget would save ten million per year, for a three-year period.

There are forty WSU Extension locations. A faculty member does not serve in nineteen of those locations. We have expanded the rolls and responsibilities of the faculty members we currently have, to maximize the services rendered statewide. In the future, we may end up grouping services together and combining counties to work together.

9:57 AM Conditional Use Permit (CUP) 2018-02 Yates

AHBL Personal Services Contractor Nicole Stickney brought Resolution 2018-292, CUP 2018-02 before the Board. This permit would allow construction and use of a proposed accessory building, which would exceed the maximum allowed square footage, and building height in the Residential Suburban 20 zoning district.

On August 28, 2018, the Planning Commission Held a duly advertised open-record public hearing and passed a motion (4-2). There were no appeals. The Planning Commission forwarded the recommendation of approval to the Board of County Commissioners based on the six findings of fact and nine suggested conditions of approval.

After an in-depth discussion, the Commissioners moved forward with a motion.

* Commissioner Koch moved to approve Resolution 2018-292, Conditional Use Permit (CUP) 2018-02 to allow construction and use of a proposed accessory building, which would exceed the maximum allowed square footage, and building height in the Residential Suburban 20 (RS-20) zoning district. Commissioner Miller seconded and the motion carried.

10:38 AM Conditional Use Permit (CUP) 2018-03 Big Bend Electrical Cooperative AHBL Personal Services Contractor Nicole Stickney brought Resolution 2018-293, CUP 2018-03 before the Board.

Big Bend Electrical Cooperative (BBEC) proposes to construct an electrical substation on parcel 120-040-535, immediately south of the border between Franklin and Adams Counties. The address is 20 Radar Hill Road, Othello, WA 99344. The property is zoned RR-5 and the Comprehensive Plan designation is Rural Remote. The proposal includes the demolition of an existing structure and construction of a new electrical substation. This new substation will serve existing load in and around the area. The approximate substation dimensions are 240' x 180' and the site plan shows the general layout including a chain link fence surrounding the facilities. The County Building and Planning Department processed the application, coordinated for agency comments (including Adams County), and reviewed the application in accordance with Chapter 17.82 Franklin County Code.

* Commissioner Miller moved to approve Resolution 2018-293, Conditional Use Permit (CUP) 2018-03 to construct and operate a proposed electrical substation, which is only allowed as a Conditional Use in the RR-5 Zoning District. Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion carried.

- The Veteran's Advisory Board has consulted with Benton and Franklin Counties Human Services. Benton County is providing managerial, financial administrative support to Veteran's assistance program. There is currently no MOU for these services. Benton County has been providing services under the Human Services resource pool. Recommendations for Franklin County's program is foreseeable in the near future.
