Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

9:01 AM Legislative Representation Olympia

Jim Potts and Zac Kennedy spoke to the Board about the upcoming initiatives being brought to Capitol Hill in the 2019 year. Items including environmental, transportation tax, public health, and gun laws will be presented. Mr. Potts will send the Commissioners information as they receive it. Mr. Potts also invited the Commissioners to attend any session they would like and that he would set up appointments with Representatives if the Commissioners so desired.

9:17 AM Approval of Minutes

November 27, 2018 Commissioners' Meeting Minutes and January 2, 2019 Commissioners' Meeting Minutes were approved as presented.

9:18 AM Short Plat 2018-24 Lot Dimension Deviation Request

Planning and Building Director Derrick Braaten gave a background for the request of a waiver on Short Plat 2018-24 to deviate from County Code lot dimension of 120 feet road frontage to 90 feet. After a brief discussion on codes, dimensions, easements, and emergency vehicle access. Commissioners asked the Developer to meet with the Director of Planning to see if there might be another layout option that would stay within the code, and bring it before the Board at the next meeting.

9:56 AM Grant Award from Washington State Health Care to Franklin County Jail for Opioid Treatment



County Administrator Keith Johnson gave a brief background of the Grant that was awarded to Franklin County Corrections for assisting with jail medical costs for the identification, assessment and treatment of inmates coming into the corrections facility who may have opioid abuse or addiction issues.

Sheriff Raymond and Commander Sultemeier reaffirmed that this would enable the Corrections department to provide medical assistance to those who would be going through withdrawals during the time of incarceration.

* Commissioner Koch called for motion to approve Resolution 2019-016 Grant Award from Washington State Health Care to Franklin County Jail for Opioid Treatment. All Commissioners voted aye.

10:12 AM Public Comment

Jeffery Robinson asked the Board if there was any progress of televising the Commissioners meetings in the future. Commissioner Koch informed Mr. Robinson that televised meetings would not take place until all county residents have access to streaming.

Mr. Robinson inquired of the process and laws behind redistricting of the County. Mr. Koch explained that the three districts could redistrict no more than every four years. The constituency between the three districts is required to be within ten percent.

Commissioner Peck added the State statues state that the three districts must be divided as evenly as possible demographically and geographically. Currently the districts are approximately fifteen percent off and are in need of redistricting.

Wendy Maiden spoke on the Short Plat 2018-24 and her opposition to the deviation of the County Code. Several of the neighbors have attended today's meeting and others who could not attend, also oppose this waiver.
