#### Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Meeting Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

**Staff Present:** County Administrator Keith Johnson, Auditor Matt Beaton, Sheriff Jim Raymond, Coroner Curtis McGary, Treasurer Josie Koelzer, Chief Deputy Treasurer Rusian Stetskiy, Human Resources Director Carlee Nave, Chief Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Jennifer Johnson, Planning and Building Director Derrick Braaten, Public Works Director Matt Mahoney, and Clerk of the Board Karin Milham

9:00 a.m. Commissioner Koch opened the Special Meeting by stating that the Commissioners were involved with an Emergency Management training on February 19, 2019 and the Commissioners Meeting was changed to February 20, 2019.

#### 9:01 a.m. Approval of Minutes

January 8, 2019 Commissioners Meeting Minutes were approved as presented.

9:02 a.m. Public Hearing-Approval of Expending \$250,000.00 from the Franklin County Reserve Fund for Improvements and Repairs Needed in the Jail Facility Supplementing the 2019 Current Expense Fund Budget

County Administrator Keith Johnson explained he was unaware at the time, that funds set aside for the jail improvements would not automatically roll over into the 2019 budget. Therefore, a Public Hearing was necessary to open the 2019 budget and dispend the funds to its appropriate budget line.

Commissioner Koch opened the Public Hearing at 9:02 a.m. to hear testimony for or against Resolution 2019-061, expending \$250,000 from reserve fund for improvement and repairs in the Jail Facility.

No testimony was given and Commissioner Koch closed the Public Hearing at 9:04 a.m.

Commissioner Peck asked Administrator Keith Johnson to explain what the function of these funds were and how they are used.

Mr. Johnson explained that the funds are being used in the old portion of the jail remodel with new paint in pods, new cuff port locks and removal of blackened windows. Updated intake area in the front of jail for better classification of inmates when they arrive at the jail.

Sheriff Raymond stated that this is just one part of the compliance and that is should be completed by the end of February. Sheriff Raymond also informed the Board that there is no longer a work release program and they are slowly converting this space into a women's facility.

# 9:11 a.m. Request to Convert on Corrections Deputy Position to Corrections Lieutenant and Define the Salary for the Corrections Lieutenant Position

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave explained the during the 2019 budget process, the Sheriff requested the addition of two corrections lieutenant position so serve as "watch commanders" to help enhance supervisory controls in the Corrections Center. The intent of these positions is to professionally and consistently maintain inmate due process and ensure accountability for first line supervision activities. The positions would provide continuous oversight to various programs including volunteer and visitation program coordination, objective jail classification of offenders based on behavior and the crimes they commit, and assisting with public and legal requests for data, video, phone records, and more. The Lieutenants would help stabilize jail operations by working modified midafternoon hours and weekend, providing on site oversight of jail operations during off hours.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2019-062 as presented. Commissioner Didier seconded the motion carried.

# 9:20 a.m. Implementation of Compensation Study Recommended for Non-Bargaining Employees

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave requested implementation of compensation study recommended for non-bargaining employees. She explained that in order for us to accomplish this task, it would need to be broken down into segments.

Brief discussion on how the segments would be implemented.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve 2019-063 as presented. Commissioner Didier seconded and the motion carried.



#### 9:33 a.m. Public Comment

- Matt Beaton had a question from his staff about the status of Consultant and reason we did
  not finish with an independent source. Ms. Nave replied that Human Resources started out
  with a contract and funds depleted, leaving HR to finish the process.
- Kevin Hinen discussed the conditions of the snow on the county roads as being impassable.
   He had concerns as to why they had not been cleared and offered suggestions that might help with the situation.
- Butch Curtis also voiced his concerns on roads that have not been cleared of snow after 3 or 4 days. Mr. Curtis suggested hiring out if necessary.
- O Public Works Director Matt Mahoney understood their concerns and explained the provisions with work force, equipment and establishing primary routes. Franklin County is a large area to cover and North County had significant snowdrifts. Mr. Mahoney added that his crew is working hard and cares very much about the county citizens.
- Kent McMullin has assisted in the past with roads that needed clearing with a road grader to allow school buses to pass.

10:32 a.m. Longtime Franklin County resident Butch Curtis distributed a letter to the Commissioners and wished to discuss its content. Mr. Curtis discussed his concerns with the county's Public Works department discretion and its handling of roadway spraying and right-of-way maintenance. His dispute was with the Public Works department and the equipment that was used to clear crops in the county right-of-way. He submitted a claim previously in Walla Walla County, and it was denied because it was filed under District Court instead of Superior Court.

County Commissioners directed him to resubmit his claim to Franklin County.
