#### Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

#### 9:01 a.m. Approval of Minutes

January 29, 2019 and February 12, 2019 Minutes pulled.

#### 9:02 a.m. Legislative Representation from Olympia

Jim Potts and Zac Kennedy reported a lot of movement on the floor with items they oppose, passing and items they support, dismissed.

#### Bills or Initiatives discussed:

- HB 115-2019-20 Establishing policies and requirements regarding law enforcement response to domestic violence incidents to enhance the safety of domestic violence victims, families, and officers.
- o SB 5434-2019-20 Restricting possession of weapons in certain locations.
- o SB 5174-2019-20 Concerning concealed pistol license training requirements.
- o SB 5954-2019-20 Concerning the bump-fire stock buy-back program.
- O Budget may need an additional 5 billion-tax revenue. Possibly fulfilling this revenue through carbon tax, fuel tax and property tax.
- Request for a wrongful death letter of support.

Commissioner Peck clarified the process of approvals of Minutes are for additions, deletions or corrections. If there is a need to discuss an item from the minutes, it is permissible under office business.

### 9:19 a.m. Naming Rights Agreement between Franklin County and HAPO Community Credit Union.

The Commissioners asked TRAC Manager Tom French to revisit with HAPO executives to discuss the possibility of allowing TRAC to be included with the HAPO brand name. Mr. French returned this week with the information the Commissioners inquired about, stating HAPO would like to continue with the original contract including the singular name of HAPO.

The Commissioners discussed the number of years the contract covered, and whether it should be a shorter length of time. Concerns arose on the circulation of the RFP (Request For Proposal) being on the County webpage and Franklin County Graphic. Suggestions for future projects might include advertisement in the Tri-City Herald as well.

Commissioner Koch opened the meeting to those who wished to make a public comment on this matter.

Alice Didier strongly disagreed with the contract lasting ten years. She suggested that the Commissioners revisit the contract after five years and renegotiate. Ms. Didier also felt that this RFP should have been advertised in the Tri-City Herald as well.

Al Yeney disapproved of the amount of money HAPO proposed for the TRAC facility name. He also would like to see TRAC continued as part of the name. Mr. Yeney would like to see more support for the TRAC by the Commissioners.

Commissioner Peck asked for an Executive session to discuss some questions he had with Chief Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Jennifer Johnson prior to making a decision.

#### 9:56 a.m. Executive Session

RCW 42.30.110 (1) (d) to review negotiations of performance of publicly bid contracts.

Commissioner Koch recessed into Executive Session at 9:58a.m., for up to 10 minutes to review negotiations of performance of publicly bid contracts. Also in attendance Chief Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Jennifer Johnson and Clerk of the Board Karin Milham.

Commissioner Koch requested County Administrator Keith Johnson to meet with HAPO and establish an approximate dollar amount they plan to use for signage. Mr. Johnson would report to the Board next week.

Complaints were submitted of strong odor and unable to be outside or have the windows open. He asked the Board what could be done to rectify this problem. Commissioner Koch believed that the City of Pasco is over this matter.

Commissioner Peck had a discussion with the City of Pasco Manager. At the time, this was a state of the art facility but has since been used to a higher capacity causing the foul odor. He had hoped that the city would be able to take care of this and omit the unpleasant smell.

Commissioner Didier mentioned the drawdown of the Snake River and the effects of truck transport versus river transport.
