Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 11:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

11:08 a.m. TRAC Naming Rights Agreement between Franklin County and HAPO Community Credit Union

County Administrator Keith Johnson spoke in regards to the TRAC name and significance it has to the community. He felt this was a way to reduce taxpayer expenses and deemed it to be in the best interest of the county.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2019-067 TRAC Naming Rights Agreement between Franklin County and HAPO Community Credit Union as presented. Commissioner Didier seconded and the motion carried.

11:16 a.m. Public Comment

 Pasco Resident Scott Long addressed his concerns of the current county road closures and the detours on Bellevue Road. He asked when the roads would be reopened.

Discussion arose between Public Works Director Matt Mahoney, Commissioner Didier, and Commissioner Peck on the road closures due to snowdrifts and road repair, Bellevue road and when Taylor Flats Bridge would reopen.

Mr. Mahoney understood the frustrations of the community; however, his main concern is with the safety of citizens on hazardous roads. The Public Works Department is working diligently to clear, maintain, and repair roads as quickly as possible without jeopardizing the integrity of the roads.

Sheriff Raymond received complaints from residents of speeding on Bellevue road and law enforcement has been issuing tickets to those who do not comply with the speed limit.

 - Commissioner Peck moved to approve the Consent Agenda. Commissioner Didier seconded with discussion on item 1. All in favor and the motion carried.

11:53 a.m. Administration Office Business

- County Administrator Keith Johnson notified the Board of a letter received from Benton County concerning splitting the bi-county Human Services Program. He has a meeting scheduled for tomorrow to discuss options with Benton County Administration.
- Commissioner Didier asked Human Services Director Kyle Sullivan about Franklin county Veteran's Advisory Board meetings and a letter he received from Franklin County Auditor Matt Beaton. Commissioner Didier was concerned with the irregularity of meetings, the venues in which the meetings are held, and minutes not being kept. Mr. Sullivan explained that Benton County holds regular meetings in his office, they take minutes and the meetings are posted on the Benton County website.

Commissioner Koch agreed it would be best if meetings were held in a general area.

Commissioner Peck clarified that the Veteran's Advisory Board has a Chair and a Committee that is purely advisory and does not fall under the open Public Meetings Act, which contains specific rules and regulations. He is not opposed to the meetings being open, but it is not a requirement by law.

 Mr. Johnson has been working with TRIDEC and other partners relating to the Federal level draft of the Shoreline Reconveyance proposal for Congressional action. A meeting will be held on March 13, 2019 in Kennewick to discuss this matter. There will be continued identification of land parcels currently owned by Army Corps of Engineers.

Commissioner Peck stated that archeology sites would remain protected by law even if reconveyance to jurisdictions and private landowners were authorized.

 Auditor Matt Beaton appreciated the conversation on the Open Public Meeting Act (OPMA) earlier and thought it was in the best interest of the County to have the Veteran's Advisory Board meetings proceed with some guidance from the OPMA. He was looking for a consensus from the Commissioners to have the meeting dates listed on the County website and progress with a higher standard like Benton County Veteran's Advisory Board.

Commissioner Peck, Commissioner Koch and Commissioner Didier are not opposed to implementing this; however, Commissioner Peck reminded Mr. Beaton that is not a legal requirement.

Commissioner Didier asked Mr. Sullivan to speak with the Chair of the Veteran's Advisory Board and see if they would have their meetings in an open public venue on regularly scheduled dates.
