## NOTICE TO EMPLOYEES

#### STATE LAW GIVES YOU THE RIGHT TO:

- · Form, join, or assist an employee organization (union).
- Bargain collectively with your employer through a union chosen by a majority of employees.
- · Refrain from any or all of these activities.

THE WASHINGTON STATE PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT RELATIONS COMMISSION CONDUCTED A LEGAL PROCEEDING, AND RULED THAT BENTON COUNTY AND BENTON-FRANKLIN COUNTY COMMITTED AN UNFAIR LABOR PRACTICE, AND ORDERED US TO POST THIS NOTICE TO EMPLOYEES:

WE UNLAWFULLY failed or refused to bargain in good faith with Teamsters Local 839 regarding proposed changes to deferred compensation.

#### TO REMEDY OUR UNFAIR LABOR PRACTICES:

WE WILL give notice to, and upon request, negotiate in good faith with Teamsters Local 839 regarding proposed changes to deferred compensations.

WE WILL upon demand, pay the Teamsters Local 839 for their reasonable attorney fees and costs incurred in the presentation of the appeal of the instant unfair labor practice.

WE WILL NOT, in any other manner, interfere with, restrain, or coerce our employees in the exercise of their collective bargaining rights under the laws of the State of Washington.
