#### Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

## 9:01 a.m. Replacement of Senior Planner Position with Planner I or II Position

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave presented a request from the Planning department to authorize to hire one full-time employee as either a Planner I or Planner II, either option resulting in a significant reduction in expense from the budgeted Senior Planner position.

After discussion on duties, codes and covenants the Board brought it to a vote.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve the Resolution 2019-138 Replacement of a Senior Planner as presented. Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion carried 2-0. Commissioner Didier abstained.

#### 9:20 a.m. 2019-2020 Prosecuting Attorney Salary

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave presented the Prosecuting Attorney's concern regarding the formula presented in the past, arguing that the intent of the law was not to essentially give the Prosecuting Attorney (PA) half of a COLA, but to allow their salary to keep pace with that of the superior court judges.

Four different options were drafted for the Board's consideration in setting the PA's salary for 2019 and 2020. After discussion on state statues and data received, the Commissioners brought it to a vote.

\* Commissioner Peck moved to approve setting the Prosecuting Attorney's salary the same as the district court judge and have staff write up documents. Commissioner Didier seconded. After clarification of the motion, Commissioner Didier rescinded his seconded. Commissioner Peck moved to approve option #3 of Resolution 2019-138. Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion carried 2-1 with Commissioner Didier as a nay.

- o Auditor Matt Beaton was frustrated with the raise of salaries for two electeds.
- o Citizen Steve Deruyter. asked the Planner to keep a balance between farming and urban communities with proper planning.
- O Citizen Tyler Casper purchased property and built a home on Ringold erosion area. He would now like to build a shop and presented the Commissioners with documents from a geologist stating his property was safe. Planning was not as accommodating as previous years.
- o Citizen Rocky Mullen agreed that in order to have qualified people in county positions there must be fair and equitable pay.
- o Citizen Taylor Taranto would like to see the Commissioners lead by example and follow through with discussion of lowering salary.
- O Citizen Steven Bauman agreed with Rocky Mullen that fair pay was needed to bring in qualified persons for positions. He also asked for information on the urban growth boundary.
