Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

April 16, 2019 Commissioners' Meeting Minutes April 23, 2019 Commissioners' Meeting Minutes

* Commissioners' Meeting Minutes approved, with revision to add Commissioner Didier's name, to discussion on Sanctuary County in the April 16, 2019 minutes.

9:05 a.m. Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife Gray Wolf Management Update Mike Livingston, Region 3 Director introduced himself to the Board, and briefly presented information on the Gray Wolf management activities periodic status review, translocation proviso, and post delisting conservation and management plan.

- O Washington is divided into three different zones: Eastern Washington, North and South Cascades, and North West Coast
- o Rapid growth of 28% per year recovery with approximately fifteen identified breeding pairs
- o Two layers of protection for wolves in Washington State: Federal and State
- March 2019 the Department of Fish and Wildlife Service proposed to remove the gray wolf from the endangered species list
- o Strict protocol to remove wolves that are problematic with livestock or public

Citizen Lynn McIrvin from Diamond M Ranch gave testimony regarding the loss of seventy head of cattle per year to wolves, with the killings starting in 2008. He estimates his losses are over one million dollars.

Citizen Rocky Mullen gave testimony regarding wolves killing his cattle as well.

9:54 a.m. Hemp Moratorium Ordinance 02-2019

Planning and Building Director Derrick Braaten brought a six-month moratorium regarding hemp facilities within Franklin County before the Board. Mr. Braaten gave a background to the 2014 Farm Bill and the 2016 (IHRP) Industrial Hemp Research Pilot program of growing hemp. On April 25, 2019, Washington State Legislature passed E2SSB 5276, which would allow immediate growth for those in the IHRP program. However, neither the USDA nor the WSDA have created final rules for the industry. The purpose of Ordinance 02-2019 to temporarily postpone growth until final rules are in place and or allow the planning department to review data and hold a public hearing on the matter.

* After discussion, Commissioner Peck moved to approve Ordinance 02-2019. An Ordinance Imposing a Six (6) Month Moratorium on the Establishment, Locating, Permitting, Licensing or Operation of Hemp or Industrial Hemp Production, Processing, or Wholesale/Retail Facilities in Franklin County, WA, and Directing the Scheduling of a Public Hearing. Commissioner Didier asked to amend the ordinance by changing length of it to whenever the state finalizes rules. Commissioner Peck declined an amendment as the Board had given the Planner the direction to lift moratorium as soon as possible. Commissioner Koch seconded and the motion passed. 2:1 Commissioner Didier abstained.

Richard Scheuerman, Director of the Franklin County Historical Museum thanked the Board for their support. The Museum hosted over twenty-five hundred tourists last year. It is the fifty-first year of the Historical Society. We have accepted the Washington State Railroad Heritage Society archives and will be processing this large collection.
