Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Commission Chairman Robert Koch called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

Commissioners Present: Commission Chair Robert Koch, Chair Pro Tem Brad Peck and Member Clint Didier

Staff Present: County Administrator Keith Johnson, Sheriff Jim Raymond, Auditor Matt Beaton, Coroner Curtis McGary, Chief Deputy Prosecuting Attorney Jennifer Johnson, Assistant Director of Information Services Liz Cupples, Human Resources Director Carlee Nave, Public Works Director Matt Mahoney and Clerk of the Board Karin Milham.

9:01 a.m. **Bureau of Land Management (BLM) Update Related to Juniper Dunes** BLM Acting District Manager Lindsey Babcock and Acting Boarder Field Manager Eric Holborn updated the Board on the following items.

- Termination of the Eastern Washington Resource Management Plan revision effort and moving forward with one or more amendments to the 1987 RMP in fiscal year 2020. An amendment could address land tenure, off-highway vehicle area designations, and livestock grazing allocations.
- Eastern Washington Resource Advisory Council (RAC) is awaiting approval of nominated members by the Department of Interior.
- BLM have maintained an agreement where BLM provides wildland fire services on Reclamation Project Lands in portions of the Pacific Northwest. They work closely with other Interior agencies making it more efficient.
- BLM contracts with Franklin County Sheriff's Office (\$25,000 annually) for patrols in the Juniper Dunes area. Working on a current contract for this summer.
- BLM is hosting public listening sessions on July 22 and 23 Red Lion Hotel Kennewick to provide the public an opportunity to comment on how they use the Juniper Dunes Recreation Area.

9:18 a.m. Office Assistant in Planning and Building Department

Human Resources Director Carlee Nave presented the background for the request of an Office Assistant in the Planning Department. This position has been vacant until the Director Derrick Braaten could evaluate the position and revise the duties and hours to meet the needs of the department.

Commissioner Peck moved to approve Resolution 2019-186 as presented. Commissioner Didier seconded and the motion carried.

9:26 a.m. Public Comment

- Citizen Alice Didier had questions and concerns on the exterior paint trim on the HAPO Center.
- Citizen Hector Alamillo expressed his concerns on the speed on Wernett Road. Discussion arose on other options that might reduce the problem.
- Citizen asked Commissioners to be sensitive to problems that may arise at Juniper Dunes with the new access.
- Citizen George Dockstader concerned about the population increase at Juniper Dunes. Law Enforcement and medical responses that will be needed.
 He would like better growth management and possible new bridge to alleviate traffic congestion.
- Citizen Desiree Hall asked if the school impact fee is still in place. Agreed with Mr. Dockstader for the need to alleviate traffic on Roads 68 and 100.
- Citizen Jeffery Robinson articulated his right as a taxpayer to visit Juniper Dunes or any other BLM property as he chooses.
