Amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program 2019-2024

Public Works Director Matt Mahoney stated that RCW 36.81.121 requires counties to prepare and annually update their Six-Year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The TIP may be amended after it is adopted to add, delete, and amend projects to accommodate cost, schedule, scope and funding changes. The 2019-2024 TIP recommends the following additions.

- Muse Drive Bridge Replacement
- Ironwood Road Bridge Replacement
- Safety- Flashing LED Signs and Dynamic Signals
- Safety- Reflector Post for Stop Signs
- Safety- Guardrail-Curve Improvements at the Blanton Road, R-170, and Columbia River Road
- Safety- Eltopia West Railroad Crossing

At 9:06 a.m., Commissioner Koch opened the Public Hearing for public comments to hear testimony for or against the amendment to the Transportation Improvement Program. There were no comments and Commissioner Koch closed the Public Hearing.

Citizen Desiree Hall asked the Board about the mental health contracts and expressed concern over the deterioration of Lourdes Crisis Center since it changed proprietorship. She asked the Board to look into funding that would benefit the youth 13-

18 years of age.

Commissioner Peck explained the difference between the Benton Franklin Human Services 70/20 monetarily split was due to population. However, the Bi-County program is split 50/50 on decision making, as each county has their own legislative body.

County Administrator Keith Johnson explained that the Bi-County Human Services program is in the process of being restructured. Benton County will take over the Human Services program with Franklin County contracting with them as a provider.
