2020 Census Partnership Specialist Eastern Washington Licett Figueroa is working with government entities to inform them of the processes and procedures that will be taking place. An online reporting option is new this year. Each household will receive a census invitation in the mail asking them to submit information online. Phone calls and door-to-door approach will take place if persons do not respond to online application. Washington State and the Census Bureau are teaming up to administer census outreach efforts.

The responses to the 2020 Census are safe, secure and protected by federal law. They cannot be used against you in any way.

Every year, more than \$675 billion in federal funds are awarded to states and communities based on census data.

Census data guide local decision- makers in important community planning efforts, including where to build new roads, hospitals, and schools.

Census data affect your voice in Congress. The census determines how many seats each state will have in the U.S. House of Representatives as well as the redistricting of state legislatures, county and city councils, and voting districts.
