Commission Chair Pro Tem Brad Peck called the Franklin County Commissioners' Regular Board Meeting to order at 9:00 a.m., in the Commissioners' Meeting Room in the Franklin County Courthouse located at 1016 North Fourth Avenue, Pasco, Washington.

9:01 a.m. Chaplaincy Health Care Presentation

Executive Director Gary Castillo gave a brief overview of the Chaplaincy Health Care program. Chaplaincy Health Care is a non-profit organization that has been in Tri-Cities for 47 years. They are also members of the Congregations, which compile of approximately 29 different community faiths. It is most commonly known for their Hospice care, which has been serving the area for 30 years. Hospice is currently serving 200 patients. They also have a ten-bed Hospice house, which was built by volunteers 27 years ago. They are in need of a new facility and would like to increase the capacity of beds to 12. Palliative care is also part of their program, where they have nurses, chaplains, and primary care physicians who check in on those who are not ready for hospice.

They offer a behavioral health program, focus on Medicaid and Medicare patients, and extend help to those who cannot afford services.

Grief Care services are available and extend to many different areas such as; Understanding grief, Hope for the Holidays, Coming to terms, Widowed Support, Young Adult Grief, Grieving Parents, Survivors of Suicide, Infant and Pregnancy Loss. Cork's Place is designed for children 3 through 17 and their families who are grieving a death of a loved one. Currently 56 are participating in the program with 44 on a waiting list. The program is also going to area high schools to provide assistance with grief of students dealing with teen suicide or death.

Repeat Boutique is a nonprofit thrift store offering our community a great value and proceeds go to provide services to patients. They welcome donations to help in the cause.

With the growth of businesses and traffic added to the area, there needs to be changes in the roadway. He suggested an overpass for farmers to get their equipment to their fields on the opposite side of the highway, reduce speed and add turning lanes. Since this is a Washington State Department of Transportation issue, the Commissioners referred him to Representative Todd Trepanier with WSDOT in Pasco.

 - * Commissioners were in consensus to allow installation of security cameras with the understanding that upon their departure, they remove and repair or they may leave the cameras.
- Confederated Tribes of the Colville Reservation sent a letter to the Commissioners requesting a meeting with them to become better acquainted and discuss potential economic development projects related to the property the Tribes have recently purchased

in Franklin County. The Commissioners discussed this request and directed Administrator Keith Johnson to contact the Tribes and relate options that would work for both parties.

 Administrator Keith Johnson responded to a request to draft a letter to the Department of Ecology addressing two significant issues that have important and potentially negative impact for the citizens of Franklin County. Imposing wastewater fees on wineries and excluding farmer representation on the "restoration and enhancement" committees. After brief discussion, the letter to DOE will be revised and brought back.

10:43 Public Comment

Pasco citizen Steven Bauman expressed his concerns on the seriousness of the road conditions on 395 and cross streets that farmers need to cross to work their fields. Unfortunately, it will take data of accidents and deaths before WSDOT will fix issues. We need to do something before then. Sheriff Jim Raymond and Commissioner Peck suggested contacting Representatives and holding a meeting to discuss the issues.
